The children are asked to assemble in the Daily Synagogue at 6:45.

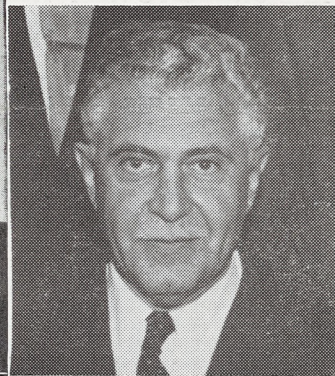

The fifth day of Chol Hamoed is called Hoshanah Rabbah. It is on this day that the decrees of Yom Kippur are sealed and the fate prescribed therein for each individual takes effect. In the time of the Temple a procession was made around the altar with the four species while the Hoshana prayers were chanted. The name of Hoshana Rabbah (the great Hoshana) was therefore given to the day.

It is a custom to read portions of holy works and to study the Torah on the night of Hoshana Rabbah, in the manner which is observed on the first night of Shavuot.
