Not far from us, in the Mea Shearim district, there is a big sign across the road, in Hebrew, of course, which says "Observe the Sabbath Day to keep it Holy." This is known as "Sabbath Square" and is the point at which cars passing on the Sabbath get pelted with stones. You probably read about this periodically.

I have been told that in the irreligious Kibbutzim they observe every holiday except Yom Kippur; they observe every holiday with a historical, national or agricultural background. Yom-Kippur is a purely religious holiday and therefore has no meaning for them.

These courses are open to everybody. There will be a nominal registration fee. Please send a note to our office telling us that you plan to attend.

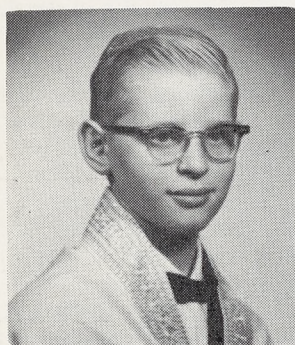

a desert land with a very limited population to its present status with a rapidly increasing population and steadily growing number of industries is one of the marvels of this generation.

Fabulously wealthy industrialists are coming from the four corners of the earth. They invest millions of pounds in the construction of buildings and development of such types of business as helped amass fortunes in their native lands. This explains how the young State of Israel (with its great problems of integrating the masses of immigrants whom it is constantly and generously admitting without reserve, and the vital problem of adequate defense against the Arabs, by whom they are surrounded on all sides and who continue to threaten to annihilate them by another war is nevertheless making such great economic strides as are unparalleled in other parts of the world, especially under the circumstances.

The modernity of developments in Israel keeps rising by leaps and bounds. Among the most recent ones is the bidding of investors for concessions to building a tourist class hotel and motel near Ein-Bodek Silver Springs, approximately eight miles north of S'dom. Another development expected in this area is mineral water bottling works. Samples of this mineral water are being tested in various laboratories in Europe.
