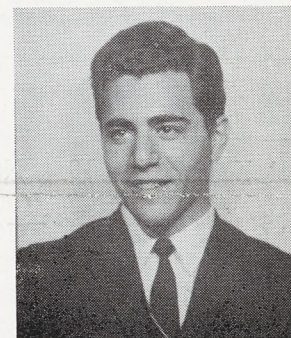

CONCLUDING PORTIONS OF THE ISRAELI DIARY OF OUR LATE REBBITZEN, REBECCA F. GOLDSTEIN

July 10, 1960

Another United Jewish Appeal day. This time in and around Jerusalem I have already seen practically everything of interest in this neighborhood but regard today's trip as a refresher course.

Dad was too busy to come along but I took Dr. and Mrs. Axelrod of the Manhattan Day School with me and they enjoyed it very much.

On King George Street, which is known as the Fifth Avenue of Jerusalem, we saw an immense bronze Menorah which occupied a prominent position in the Knesset gardens. On the occasion of the tenth anniversary of Israel it was presented to the State of Israel by Great Britain. It portrays, in sections, the outstanding events of the history of Israel, from its earliest days up to the present time, and is supposed to have taken three years to make.

Driving west out of Jerusalem proper we came upon a large tract of land which was designated as the "Kiryah", the proposed Government Center. Here there is a building already completed for the Ministry of Finance which is sometimes called "the new Wailing Wall" because people come there to wail about their taxes. The main feature in this section will be a new Parliament building for the erection of which the late Baron Rothchild left some 6 to 7 million Israel pounds.

In this same neighborhood is the Hebrew University which is vast, in the amount of space it occupies and the number of buildings it already

HALLEL (Continued)

"ATZABAYHEM" — THEIR IDOLS ARE GOLD AND SILVER

Which in the end, says the commentator R'dak, (playing upon the root of "ATZOB"), will bring "sorrow."

THEY HAVE MOUTHS, BUT THEY SPEAK NOT; EARS HAVE THEY, BUT THEY HEAR NOT; ETC.

It should have read "they do not speak, they do not hear, they do not see," etc. Why the additional words of mouth, ears, eyes, etc. The Maggid of Dubnow explained that these additional words are additional cynicism, namely they are no gods, because they have a mouth, ear, eyes, etc., the organs of mortal beings, and they are lower than man, who can speak, hear, and see etc., which they cannot do.

YE THAT FEAR THE L--D

This is the highest attainment of man, to fear the L--d. In Psalm 135 the top rung of the spiritual ladder is given to those who fear the L--d, as we read in verses 19 and 20, "O house of Israel bless ye the L--d; O house of Aaron, bless ye the L--d; O house of Levi, bless ye the L--d; ye that fear the L--d, bless ye the L--d".

fear the L--d", refers to the proselytes, and Ibn Ezra says that it refers to men of all nations, who fear the L--d.

A special museum was dedicated on the University grounds in honor of the Queen of Belgium upon her recent visit to Israel. The National Library building, now in the process of construction, will contain two million books.

The immense new Hadassah Hospital in this same area, now nearing completion, will include among other facilities, a school for nurses, a medical school and the hospital itself which is semi-circular in form thus allowing for a maximum of light and air.

Also in this neighborhood is a settlement known as Kiryat Hayovel, which was established in celebration of the 50th anniversary of the founding of the Jewish National Fund, by the Government and the Jewish Agency.

Kiryat Hayovel has a population of twenty thousand new immigrants who are given the opportunity, upon their arrival, to purchase homes for themselves with as small a down payment as two hundred pounds. This could be a loan which they could repay as soon as they begin to work and then a monthly payment of twenty pounds over as long a period of years as they will find necessary.

This settlement has a very modern health center and an attractive shopping district, two banks, a movie house, a beautiful school and many other normal community requirements.
