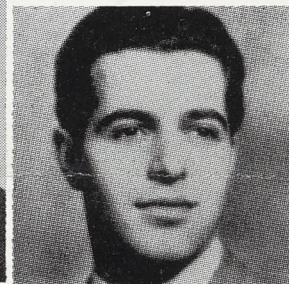

CONCLUDING PORTIONS OF THE ISRAELI DIARY OF OUR LATE REBBITZEN, REBECCA F. GOLDSTEIN

August, 1960

Our next stop was at the Hechal Shlomo. This building is intended to serve as the seat of the Chief Rabbinate of Israel and of a religious centre. It is hoped that it will be a source of inspiration for the whole world because from it will come forth the message of the Torah. It is expected to offer religious and ethical guidance to the Jews of the Diaspora.

Among other Hechal Shlomo features are a Rabbinical Library comprising tens of thousands of books on Jewish religious topics. This library is symbolic of the "ingathering of the exiles" as among its rich collections are to be found many invaluable tomes which were rescued from the ruins of the Jewish communities of Europe.

A "FOUND" WEEK-END FOR OUR TEEN-AGERS

Another teen-age Youth Conclave sponsored by the Yeshiva University Synagogue Council Youth will be held during the week-end of March 2nd, in Great Neck, New York. The event will see teen-agers from more than thirty-five communities in the area come together for a dynamic experience in Jewish living.

The program, evolving about the theme, "Design for Jewish Living," combines educational, religious, social and recreational activities and features stimulating panels and discussions on current Jewish issues, guest personalities and workshops in leadership skills. The conclave, a representative body of area Synagogue youth, seeks to promote teen-age Synagogue effort on behalf of Torah Judaism, while providing for an exchange of cultural and social experiences.

There is also a large public reading reception room and a religious information centre, with a research department, which represents a significant innovation designed to serve one of the major objects of Hechal Shlomo. It is to answer inquiries from Israel and from Jewish communities abroad in the realm of Halacha and religious research.

One floor of this building is reserved in its entirety for the court-rooms, offices and chambers of the Religious Tribunals. The great courtroom of the Supreme Rabbinical Court breathes an atmosphere of awe and dignity. A separate wing on this floor contains the legal offices and reception rooms of their Eminences the Chief Rabbis of Israel.

One of the most interesting features of the Hechal Shlomo is a religious museum, which possesses a vast and unique collection of exhibits and represents an interesting picture of the history of the Jewish people from ancient times to our own generation of Jewish national revival. It is divided into three parts: The first and greater section covers Jewish history until the early 20th century, the second part is devoted to the tragic European holocaust and the last covers the State of Israel in the making and its establishment.

The building is crowned by a large hall of convocation, which with its gallery has seating accommodations for over 1,000 people. It has a fine architectural design, its wide and elongated windows looking out

A NOTE TO OUR HEBREW SCHOOL PARENTS

One aspect of learning Hebrew is the mastery of reading Hebrew which is acquired only by practice. Our pupils are taught how to read in class, but our limited time cannot be spent for reviewing, which the pupils could do on their own. Will you kindly see to it that your children spend about 10 minutes a day in practice reading.

In order that our pupils utilize the maximum advantages of their Hebrew School curriculum, we need the cooperation of our parents.

We suggest that children be encouraged to recite appropriate prayers for the morning, after meals and before going to sleep. If some of our pupils do not make sufficient progress, tutoring may be required.

For this reason also we urge you to send your children to our Saturday Morning Junior Congregation, which meets at 10:40 o'clock. How else will children feel at home in a Synagogue if they are never introduced to a religious service on their level?

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Additives Pose Kashruth Problem

The growing popularity of all-vegetable substitutes for milk and cream has brought a number of inquiries from sharp-eyed shoppers. They have asked about the meaning of two ingredients frequently found listed on the labels of such foods. These are sodium caseinate and sorbitan monostearate.

Sodium caseinate is produced from a milk source. Therefore, all pareve cream-substitutes under Ⓢ supervision do not contain sodium caseinate. Sorbitan monostearate normally is made from animal fat sources and unless this ingredient was specially produced under rabbinical supervision, it is to be considered not kosher. This ingredient is made from vegetable sources when it is present in Ⓢ products and has been produced under Ⓢ rabbinical supervision.
