FINAL INSTALLMENT OF THE ISRAELI DIARY OF OUR LATE REBBITZEN REBECCA F. GOLDSTEIN OF BLESSED MEMORY

August, 1960

Although I am much absorbed with Dad's situation and all it entails, I don't fail to read the Jerusalem Post, to keep abreast with what is going on at present and there are certainly many stimulating things going on.

A very strong effort is being made to revive as many as possible of the customs of days gone by. The following extract from the Jerusalem Post is a case in point:

"An ancient Tannaitic custom is again being revived this year at the Ponievicz Yeshiva in Bnei Brak, where the 'Yarkhei Kalla' sessions of religious study for the people begins tomorrow . . . This is patterned after the meetings which used to be held two months out of the year in Ellul and Adar, at the great Yeshivot of Babylonia, where ritual and theological problems that had accumulated in the people's minds in the preceding few months were thrashed out in the presence of the luminaries of the Torah . . . Rabbi Cahanaman, who has been head of the Yeshiva for sixteen years, is a very wise and progressive man and the Yeshiva is a vast city in itself, due to Rabbi Cahanaman's ability and success in gathering funds on his trips to different parts of the world . . . The present arrangements, however, differ not only in the duration of the sessions, a fortnight instead of two months, but also in the provisions for those who attend. They are given complete vacation: room and board with their wives, whom they bring along. The married couples have a special part of the dining room to themselves, with a separate entrance and exit. The vacationers have a buffet, a post office bureau and a library at their disposal and transportation."
