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TALMUD ENCYCLOPEDIA REACHES 10th VOLUME

Rabbi Herbert S. Goldstein, Chancellor of the World Academy in Jerusalem, has announced that the tenth volume of the Encyclopedia Talmudit has rolled off the Israeli presses.

The Encyclopedia is a unique work which lucidly presents the complete field of Jewish civilization from the Bible down to modern times. It traces both the Biblical and Talmudic sources for each specific Halakha or legal problem coupled with the interpretation through the ages.

Published in Jerusalem under the editorship of the famed Rabbi S. J. Zevin, the Encyclopedia was praised by the late Chief Rabbi Isaac Halevi Herzog as "the outstanding Jewish literary achievement of the last 400 years." Its research staff numbers over one hundred prominent scholars, many of whom are refugees from Hitler's persecution and includes several Chief Rabbis.

Plans are under way in Jerusalem to provide an English translation of the Encyclopedia. A number of world famous scholars are now at work to make this possible thereby opening up the gates of Talmudic knowledge to the public at large.
