Since we may not possess chometz on Passover it is necessary to transfer ownership of Chometz to a non-Jew before Passover. All left-over chometz which cannot be disposed of before Passover and will therefore be sold should be set aside and kept out of bounds during Passover week.

Rabbi Pekier will be available this week to attend to the sale of Chometz from 6:40 to 9:30 A.M. and from 5:30 to 7:00 P.M.

An Open Letter To The Federation Of Jewish Philanthropies

With the Help of G-d,
March 27, 1962.

The President and Board of Trustees of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies,
130 East 59th Street,
New York 22, N. Y.
Gentlemen:—

Herewith is a copy of a newspaper report, "A Roman Catholic hospital in Reading, Pa., has opened a special kitchen to provide food for Jewish patients," which gladdened and saddened me. It made me sad because of the shame I felt that my Jewish brethren have failed a large segment of the Jewish community, in New York City. It made me glad because even the Catholic church has opened a kosher kitchen for the convenience and well-being of Jewish patients.

This is the explanation given by their Sister St. Robert: "We know that a patient who is used to certain menus, and having the food prepared in accordance with his religious beliefs, will find greater relief at the hospital if he can obtain that food there." May I say, can Jews do less than these Catholic nuns? The cost to the hospital in Reading, St. Joseph's, was \$8,000.00 and the kosher kitchen will be supervised by a Rabbi.

Long Island Jewish Hospital, Mount Sinai, Beth David — all hospitals under Federation, have failed to take full care of their patients who are observant Jews.

I have been a nominal member of the Federation since it was organized. I have done so for many years because I did not want to separate myself from the community.

If you could see your way clear to have the hospitals install kosher kitchens, I am fairly certain that I could raise a good part of the money necessary. Please put me to the task, after you will have the will to do complete justice to the observant Jews in the hospitals under Federation.

P. S. To have the Federation provide sandwiches for some, or to have cold food brought in and warmed up, is in my judgment, only a step to forestall further protests — but not our consciences.

PASSOVER LAWS

Wheat, rye, barley, spelt and oats, in contact with water either in the grain form or after being milled, would render them chometz. During the Passover week, the minutest amount "Ma-shehu" of chometz when mixed with any other food, would render the whole chometz.

To make certain that one does not violate the laws of chometz, food or beverages require strict supervision in keeping with the Jewish law. It is a sad fact that some unscrupulous merchants have been known to take advantage of the public by using labels "kosher le-Pesach" indiscriminately. If in doubt about the reliability of the kashrus of products, consult your Rabbi.

All vegetables and fruits may be used except rice, millet, peas and beans.
