**RE ONE OF THE 1,012 BILLS
PASSED BY OUR
STATE LEGISLATURE**

For years the Synagogue was strangled, as it were, because some people thought we were not allowed to have more than 45 directors; as a matter of fact, the Attorney General Louis J. Lefkowitz, answering Rabbi Goldstein's letter inquiring about this matter, was informed there was no limitation as to the number of directors.

After consultation with Mr. Greenfield of the Attorney General's office, Rabbi Goldstein hit upon the idea of having a Bill introduced in the Legislature increasing the number of our trustees up to 72. At present we only have 9. This means that hereafter we will not have trustees and directors, but only trustees. Now we have a wide enough range to add a number of new trustees who can strengthen our board with fresh ideas and share in the work for our future.

The Bill, introduced by Senator MacNeil Mitchell and Assemblyman Bentley Kassal, received unanimous approval of both houses of the Legislature. It was signed last week by Governor Rockefeller.

We also want to thank our Director Samuel K. Beier with whom Rabbi Goldstein consulted in regard to this matter.
