Thursday evening we usher in the Festival of Shevuos, the Feast of Weeks. This Holiday is of great significance in the Jewish calendar. The Holiday identifies us as Jews, for on this day we received the Torah at Mt. Sinai. It is therefore known as "Zman Matan Torasenu," The Season of Receiving our Torah.

To commemorate this divine event we decorate our Synagogue with leaves and flowers reminiscent of the greenery atop Mt. Sinai.

Another hallowed tradition is the "Mishmar," the staying up all night in the Synagogue and reciting "Tikun Shevuos," selections from the Bible and Mishna and other sacred writings. Our readers are cordially invited to join us in the Synagogue beginning at 10:15 on Thursday night for this all-night vigil. The morning service for those who are awake the whole night is held at daybreak.

It is a tradition to eat dairy foods on this festival. One reason given is that the Torah has been likened to "milk and honey."

During the Morning Services of the first day, we read the Ten Commandments and chant the Akdamos, a beautiful poem in Aramaic, lauding the greatness of the Lord and the Torah, and describing a future of bliss and peace for the righteous.

On the Second Day, the idyllic story of Ruth is read. This is to commemorate the Yahrzeit of King David who died on Shevuos and was descended from Ruth.

ERUV TAVSHILIN Thursday Afternoon Erev Yom Tov

It is not permissible to cook, bake or prepare food on one day of Yom Tov for the next day or for the Sabbath. The "Eruv Tavshilin" set aside prior to the Festival, enables the housewife to cook on Friday for the Sabbath. Inasmuch as this year Shavuot will be on Friday and Saturday, the ceremony of Eruv Tavshilin should be performed on Thursday, Erev Yom Tov.

Challah and some cooked food, such as fish, are placed on a plate. The master of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ataw a-do-noy elo-kenu melech ha-olam asher kidsha-nu b'mitzvo-sav v'tzi-va-nu al mitzvahs e-ruv . . . By virtue of this Eruv, be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath."

On Saturday afternoon the food thus prepared may be eaten.

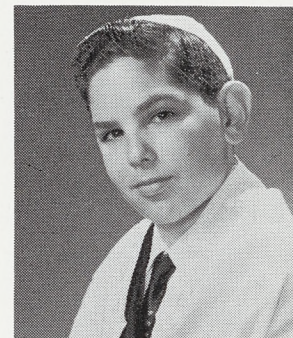
