As with every festival, Kiddush is recited over the wine, and the Shehecheyanu is added. On the second night, a new fruit which has not yet been eaten in its season, is placed on the table for the Shehecheyanu of the Kiddush, which embraces also the fruit.

To emphasize the importance of this day of Reflection and Judgment, many ceremonies and customs are observed on Rosh Hashonah such as dipping the HAMOTZI in honey to denote a sweet year.

The Shofar

The Shofar or ram's horn is the keynote of the Holiday (Yom Teruah). Its sound reminds the people (Yom Hazikaron) of the solemnity of the occasion, the Day of Judgment (Yom Hadin). Since the first day of Rosh Hashonah is Saturday, the Shofar will be sounded only on Sunday.

Tashlich

A moving and deeply symbolic ritual, known as Tashlich, takes place on the first day of Rosh Hashonah when we go to a body of water and symbolically shake ourselves free of our sins. This ceremony is observed on the first day of the Holiday. This year, however, it will be observed on Sunday.

Shabbos Shuva

The Sabbath following Rosh Hashana is known as the Sabbath of Repentance because of the Haftorah chanted on this Sabbath from the Prophetic Book of Hosea which begins with the words, SHUVA YISRAEL, "Return (or repent) O Israel to the L-rd, thy G-d."

As is customary every year, Rabbi Reichel will deliver his Shabbos Shuva Halachic Discourse after Mincha.
