SUCCOS NOTES

With the setting of the sun this evening we usher in the Festival of Tabernacles. Following the solemn High Holidays, it is, in contrast, a time of joyous celebration. The keynote of its observance is as expressed in the phrase "Vesumach-taw Bechagechaw," "And thou shalt rejoice in thy festival."

The Succah

The festival derives its name from the Succah, a temporary dwelling built especially for the holiday. The temporary nature of the Tabernacle is symbolic of the tribulations faced by the Jew in this world. Meals should be eaten in the Succah.

Hoshanah Rabbah

The fifth day of Chol Hamoed is called Hoshanah Rabbah. It is on this day that the decrees of Yom Kippur are sealed and the fate prescribed therein for each individual takes effect. In the time of the Temple a procession was made around the altar with the four species while the Hoshana prayers were chanted. Seven circuits are made this day.

It is a custom to read portions of holy works and to study the Torah on the night of Hoshanah Rabbah, in the manner which is observed on the first night of Shavuos.

Our Teen Agers Club will have their first get-together Sunday morning, Nov. 4th at 10:30 o'clock. Please pass the word around.

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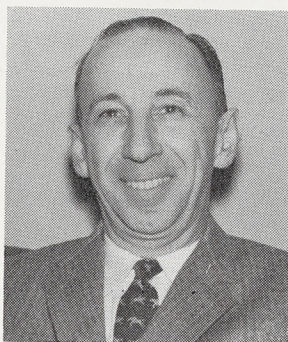
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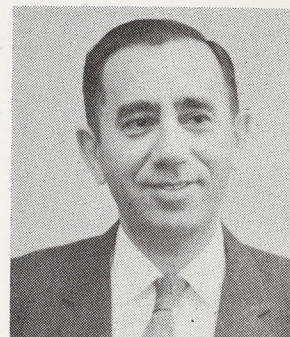
