PURIM NOTES

Fast of Esther:

Thursday, March 7th

The day before Purim is called "Taanis Esther." This recalls the penitence and fast of the Jews in the days preceding the Purim miracle.

Inasmuch as it is not permitted to fast on the Sabbath (except Yom Kippur) the fast will take place this year on the Thursday before Purim.

Reading of the Megillah:

**Saturday night, March 9th
and Sunday Morning**

It is obligatory upon men, women and children to hear the reading of the Megillah night and day because all were included in the evil decree of Haman — and all were redeemed. (Kindly see Prayer Schedule).

Purim is a special occasion for giving gifts and remembering the poor. The gifts, "Mishloach Manos", consists of two portions of prepared food for two friends.

On Purim day the festive meal should begin before sundown.

Our worshippers are reminded to bring their Purim Megillahs by Friday Mincha in order to use them following the Saturday Maariv Service.

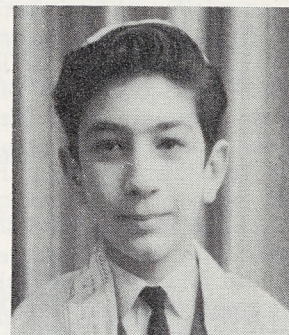
