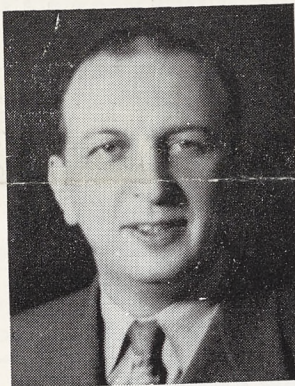

gogue.

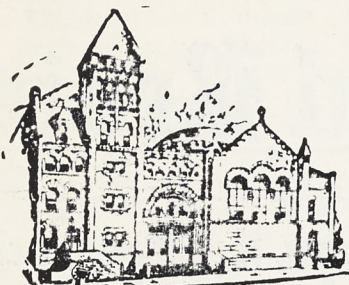
Our Chasan Maftir, who will chant
