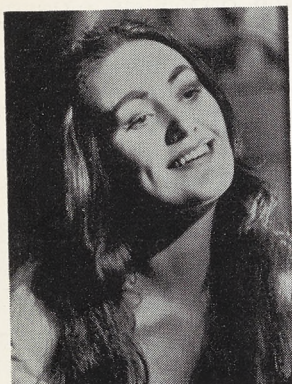

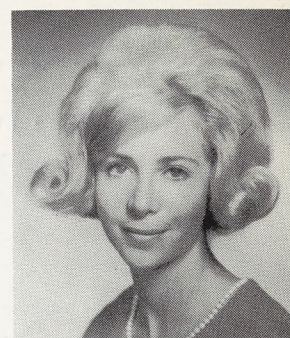
GETTING PERSONAL
