BUY ORDERS FOR OPERA BENEFIT OF LUCIA DI LAMMERMOOR ON JAN. 5th SWAMP SYNAGOGUE OFFICE

The Opera Committee and Synagogue office staff are under heavy pressure trying to fill the phone and mail orders for our Benefit Performance of Lucia Di Lammermoor at the Metropolitan Opera on Sunday eve., January 5th, starring Joan Sutherland and Richard Tucker.

It is gratifying to report that there was an immediate favorable response to our announcement of this year's Benefit Performance. On the very next morning phone calls started to come into the Synagogue and our mail has been flowing with orders since then. Within two weeks the sold-out sign was hung on all \$125 and \$150 Boxes, the \$15 sections in the Orchestra and in the Grand Tier, the \$12 and \$9 sections in the Dress Circle, the \$6.50 section in the balcony, and the \$4.50 section in the Family Circle.

Your Help Is Needed Now

The main task ahead for our Congregants is to sell the hundreds of remaining tickets, especially those in the Orchestra, from which we derive the greater revenue.

Not only have members of the Congregation come forward, but many friends who know our Synagogue by name only, have also responded, as in years past.

Notable among these friends is Mrs. J. W. Bernstein, a prominent member of many Jewish, Cultural and Music Clubs, who has now sold over 150 tickets to members of her organizations.

From Patchogue, Long Island, a bus has been chartered to bring some 40 members of that community to our Benefit. This was accomplished by Dr. Bernard Feldman of Patchogue who is glad, as he says, "to bring culture to Patchogue and in the meantime support a worthy institution."

Some 46 teachers of P.S. 180 will attend, thanks to Mr. George Austin, a teacher of that school.

Miss Lee Willis, a Nurse at Montefiore Hospital, has been instrumental in the sale of tickets to the professional staff there and Mrs. Isabel Maders of New York Hospital has

likewise cooperated splendidly. Mrs. Catherine Drayton deserves mention for her efforts in popularizing our Opera to members of her organizations.

We are also delighted to note that Dr. Herbert K. Lerman, a Hebrew educator of Long Island, is responsible for the sale of a block of fifty tickets in his community.

Mention should also be made of the many out-of-towners as far as Allentown, Baltimore, Jackson (Mississippi), Philadelphia, Stanford, and Sunbury who are loyal patrons of our annual Opera Benefits.

The complete success of this important event, however, depends upon the efforts of each and every member and friend of our Synagogue in the sale of all the 3,500 tickets which will fill the Opera House.
