The proceedings of the evening will be broadcast live over Station WEVD, at which time Rabbi Pinchas M. Teitz of Elizabeth, N.J., will conduct his weekly radio Talmud lecture (Daf Hashavua).

All our readers are invited to attend this momentous occasion. It will mark both the 50th Anniversary of Ezras Torah and the 40th year in which Rabbi Henkin has been at its head.

## H. WILLIAM HIRSCH, MAN OF THE YEAR

### SHABBOS SHEKOLIM, FEB. 8th

Saturday, February 8th, marks the first of the Special Sabbaths preparatory to the Passover Holiday season. This day is known as Shabbat Shekalim and is observed every year on the Sabbath preceding Rosh Chodesh Adar.

On each of these special Sabbaths there is a special Torah reading which refers to the half shekel that every Israelite of twenty years of age or over gave as his equal share toward the support of the Temple (Exodus 30:11-16).

In the days of the Temple in Jerusalem, it was the custom to remind all of their obligation to give the half shekel on the first day of Adar. Hence, we read this portion of the Law as near as possible to Rosh Chodesh Adar.

**AN URGENT MESSAGE TO OUR CONGREGANTS****The New Midtown Mikvah Project**

**A Mikvah is traditionally the first and most vital institution in any truly Jewish community, taking precedence even over synagogues and schools. We may even sell a Sefer Torah to help make it possible.**

For the past twenty-five years our area has been served by the Mikvah located on 158 West 97th Street. Through this Mikvah countless Jewish families have observed the sacred level of marriage and Jewish brides have embarked on the adventure of married life in a spirit of consecration. This Mikvah is due to be demolished by the end of this year as part of the West Side Urban Renewal plans. Title to the building has already passed to the City.

All Orthodox Synagogues on the East and West of Mid-Manhattan have pledged their congregations to assist in the erection of a new, modern and beautifully appointed Mikvah. For this purpose a site on a most favorable location (78th Street off Broadway) has already been purchased and plans are well advanced for the immediate commencement of the construction in order to insure the continuity of this most indispensable facility.

The total cost of this project is estimated at \$250,000 of which we hope to receive between 1/4 and 1/3 from the proceeds of the sale of the present building to the City. The remainder has been allocated proportionately to all participating Synagogues, our share being \$7,000.

**We now plead with you to rally to our support with traditional Jewish generosity in a supremely sacred cause. Every Jew belonging to a traditional Synagogue should deem it a debt of honor to his Jewish conscience to have a personal share in this great enterprise. Even those who have no occasion actually to use this communal facility should feel the urgency to participate in this effort, just as childless persons, too, should contribute to the cause of Jewish education. This campaign must be successfully concluded by the end of March.**

One who contributes \$250 or more may become a Patron. Your immediate attention and early response to this appeal in any amount will be deeply appreciated inasmuch as the builders will start as soon as the necessary funds will be available. If you wish, you may pay one half of your pledge now and one half next year. You may make out your check to the W.S.I.S. Your donation will be credited toward the obligation assumed by our Synagogue.

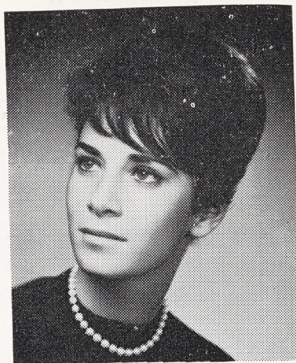
