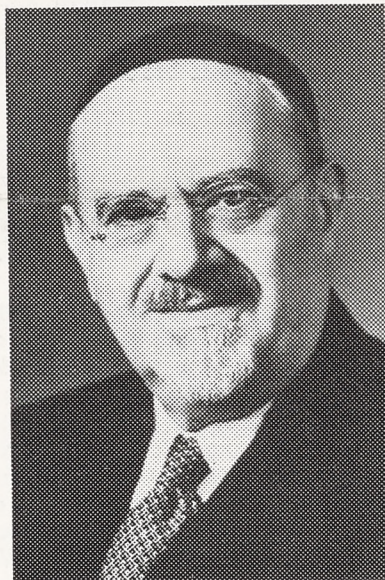
SHEVUOS YIZKOR APPEAL

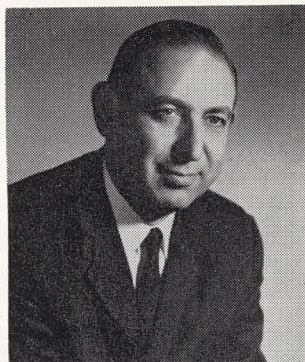

For the first time in the history of World Fairs, a kosher shomer shabbos food facility will be provided at the New York World's Fair to meet the needs of Jewish visitors. The Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America is sponsoring an Educational Exhibit and Kosher Food Bar, situated on the Mezzanine of the World's Fair Hall of Education, which is located near the Bell System Pavilion on the Promenade of Industry and not far from the main entrance to the Fair.

The ① Snack Bar will offer a wide range of traditional Jewish delicacies.

The exhibition features a graphic, fascinating portrayal of the role of traditional Judaism — the timeless Faith and Way of Life of the Jewish people as a dynamic, creative force in the development of a better America. The rich variety of orthodox Jewish institutions, schools and communal activities will be depicted and characteristic phases of Jewish religious life will be brought into colorful perspective.

The Hall of Education, to which there is no admission charge, is a building of unusual Jewish interest. There is a nominal ten cents admission charge to the UOJCA Exhibit and Kosher Food Serving Facility.

Each visitor to the UOJCA Exhibit will enjoy the opportunity to win an all-expenses-paid round trip to Israel. Registration for the four trips offered will be free.

Afternoon (Mincha) and Evening (Ma'ariv) Services will be held daily during May thru August at 7:00 P.M., and during September and October at 6:00 P.M.
