**RECEPTION FOR OUR  
NEW NEIGHBORS**

Mr. and Mrs. Isidore Denburg, our new members, have graciously made their home available for our Rabbi and Mrs. Reichel to greet in person our new neighbors in their building on Monday evening, April 12th, between the hours of 8:00 and 9:30 o'clock. Mr. and Mrs. Denburg reside at 15 West 72nd Street, Apt. 6D. Our readers are requested to urge their friends in the Lincoln Center area to stop by that evening.

**Shabbos Hagadol**

The Sabbath before Passover (April 10th) is called "Shabbos Hagadol" or the Great Sabbath. At the Mincha service we read a part of the Passover Hagadah. It is also customary for the Rabbi to deliver a discourse on laws relating to the Festival that day. Rabbi Reichel will again deliver the "Drasha" at the morning service.

**What Is Chometz?**

Wheat, rye, barley, spelt and oats, in contact with water becomes chometz. During the Passover week, the minutest amount of chometz when mixed with any other food, would render the whole chometz. All vegetables and fruits may be used except rice, millet, peas and beans.

**Kashering**

We set aside special dishes and utensils for the festival. However, under certain conditions, some of the utensils used throughout the year may also be used on Passover. Metal pots and pans can be kashered by first thoroughly cleaning them at least a day before, and then purging them in a pot of boiling water.

**CONGREGATIONAL SEDER  
RESERVATIONS MUST BE IN OUR  
OFFICE BY APRIL 13th**

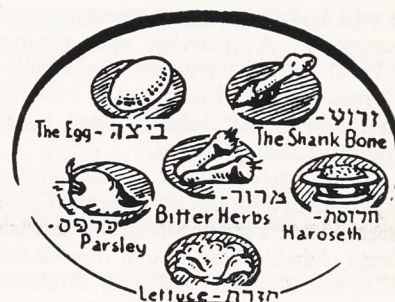
Our Congregational Sedorim will be held at the Bolivar Hotel, Central Park West and 83rd Street, on Friday and Saturday nights, April 16th and 17th. Rabbi Reichel and Cantor Ellner will officiate. The charge for each Seder is \$15.

Please note that on Friday evening our Seder will begin at 7:15 o'clock and on Saturday night at 7:45 o'clock.

Utensils used directly over the fire may be kashered by placing them directly over the fire, allowing them to get red-hot. Glassware should be scoured and then soaked in water for three days, changing the water every twenty-four hours. Earthenware cannot be kashered.

*The Synagogue facilities for public kashering of vessels will be available on Sunday, April 11th, from 1:30 to 3:00 P.M., and Thursday, April 15th, from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 noon.*

Every part of the oven or stove which may have been reached by food during the year, must be thoroughly cleaned and scraped. The oven and range must then be heated to a glow. Special tin sheets are placed over the top of the range.

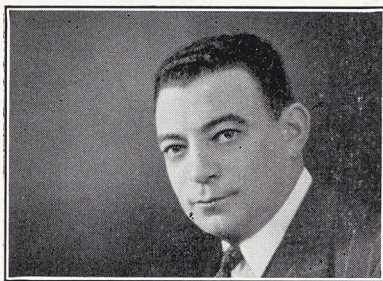

**Search for Leaven**

The search for leaven should be conducted on Thursday evening, April 15th, as soon as possible after sunset. The appropriate blessing and the Aramaic formula, "Kol Chamira" should be recited (most Haggadahs have these texts). The latter declares that we wish to annul and "declare as the dust of the earth" all manner of leaven which we did not find during the search.

The entire household (including the children) should take part in the search.

The crumbs which were collected in the search the night before should be burned by 10:40 on Friday morning, April 16th. At this time the second "Kol Chamira" formula should be recited. Thus, any chometz which remains in a Jew's possession over the Passover holiday, whether by accident or purposely, not having been previously sold in accordance with the law, is forbidden to be eaten after Passover.

No matzah may be eaten on Erev Passover because we should eat matzah at the Seder in the evening with appetite.

**Fast of the First-Born**

Every first born should fast on Erev Passover, in thankfulness to G-d for having spared the first born of the Israelites when he smote those of the Egyptians. One may forego the fast if he participates in the customary "Siyum Bechorim" which takes place right after the Morning Services on Friday. Consult our Prayer Schedule for the time most convenient for you.

**Counting Of The Omer**

The Counting of the Omer begins on the second night of Passover, Saturday, April 17th, and continues each evening until Shevuos.

The "Omer" is a measure of barley which was offered at the Temple, after which the Jews were permitted to eat the new harvest.

During this period of counting the Omer many tragedies occurred in later times. Therefore some rules of mourning are observed. Wedding celebrations and other joyous occasions involving music are forbidden. A Rabbi should be consulted concerning those days on which exceptions are made.

**Eruv Tavshilin Thursday, April 22nd**

It is not permissible to cook, bake or prepare food on one day of Yom Tov for the next day or for the Sabbath. The "Eruv Tavshilin" set aside prior to the Festival, enables the housewife to cook on Friday for the Sabbath. Inasmuch as this year the last day of Passover falls on Saturday, the ceremony of Eruv Tavshilin should be performed on Chol Hamoed Thursday.

A matzoh and some cooked food, such as fish, are placed on a plate. The master of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ataw a-donoy elo-kenu me-lech ha-olam asher kid-sha-nu b'mitz-vo-sav v'tzi-va-nu al mitzvahs e-ruv . . . By virtue of this Eruv, be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath."

On Saturday afternoon the food thus prepared on Thursday may be eaten.
