A REQUEST

It is requested that women should be attired as befitting worshipping in the House of G-d.

HOLY DAY NOTES

At sundown this Sunday Jews all over the world will usher in the Jewish New Year which is also known as Yom Hazikaron, or the Day of Remembrance, signifying a time for serious thoughts concerning our deeds and for our repentance.

Rosh Hashanah Eve

As with every festival, Kiddush is recited over the wine and Shehechyanu is added. On the second night, a new fruit which has not yet been eaten in its season is placed on the table for the Shehechyanu of the Kiddush which embraces also the fruit.

It is customary to dip the Hamotzi in honey to denote a sweet year.

Mussaf Service

The Rosh Hashanah Mussaf Service is by far the longest Amidah in the Prayer Book. In the repetition of the Amidah by the Cantor, the sounding of the Shofar is repeated following the recitation of a series of Biblical quotations relating to: (1) Malchiot — G-d's sovereignty over all the world; (2) Zichronot — G-d as the supreme Judge; and (3) Shofrot — the sounding of the Shofar emphasizing our faith.

Tashlich

Tashlich, a deeply symbolic tradition, takes place on the first day of Rosh Hashanah when we go to a body of water and symbolically free ourselves of our sins.

Shabbos Shuva

The Sabbath following Rosh Hashanah is known as the Sabbath of Repentance because of the Haftarah chanted on this Sabbath from the Prophetic Book of Hosea which begins with the words, SHUVA YISRAEL, "Return (or repent) O Israel to thy G-d."

As is customary every year, Rabbi Reichel will deliver his Shabbos Shuva Halachic Discourse on Saturday afternoon after Mincha.

Erev Yom Kippur

The Erev Yom Kippur Mincha service precedes the

final meal of that day. The "Al Chate" prayer of Yom Kippur is added to the Shmoneh Essray of Mincha (this Mincha service is found in the Yom Kippur Machzor). Successive Mincha services on Erev Yom Kippur are conducted at our Synagogue from 1:45 to 3:30 P.M.

Reminder: bring non-leather footwear for Yom Kippur.

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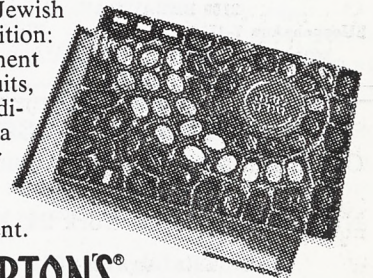
