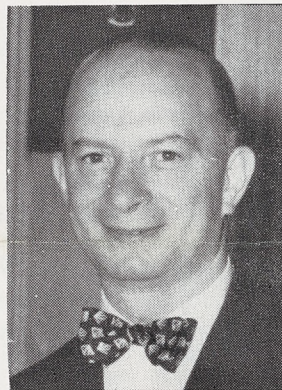

We are happy to announce the names of those to be honored by our Synagogue at our Simchas Torah services.

Mr. Stephen Klein has been chosen to be the Chassan Torah and will receive the closing Aliyah of the Torah. Mr. Klein, who heads many religious philanthropic causes (as well as Barton's), joined our Congregation as soon as he moved into our community several years ago and he has been an active member ever since.

Mr. Sol Redlich, the Chassan Brayshis, will receive the first Aliyah in the Book of Genesis. Mr. Redlich, a regular worshipper and member for many years, has been in the forefront of all our Congregational endeavors. He is likewise active in many religious institutions.

The Chassan Maftir, who will chant the Prophetic portion from the Book of Joshua, is our Synagogue Secretary, Mr. Jack Verschleiser. Mr. Verschleiser is a WSIS product — our Synagogue was his second home. It was not long before he was on the staff of our Hebrew School and Social Department. After Harvard Law School and a stint in the Army he returned to the West Side. We consider him our ambassador in the Lincoln Center area.

The Chassanim will be the hosts at a festive Seudah Shlishis Saturday afternoon, October 23rd, following the Mincha service. All are welcome.

TRUSTEE JUDGE FRANK SUPREME COURT NOMINEE

We felicitate our distinguished Trustee, Judge Harry B. Frank, who has been nominated for the office of Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of New York for the first Judicial District comprising Manhattan and The Bronx. Judge Frank has been a Justice of the City Court and is presently Judge of the Civil Court under the consolidation of the courts. Last year he was reelected for another ten year term in judicial office with the endorsement of all the major political parties. For the past eight years he has been serving as Acting Justice of the Supreme Court by designation of the Appellate Division.

SUCCOS NOTES

On Sunday eve we usher in the Festival of Tabernacles. Following the solemn High Holidays, it is, in contrast, a time of joyous celebration. The keynote of its observance is as expressed in the phrase "Vesamachtaw Bechagechaw." (And thou shalt rejoice in thy festival). Meals should be eaten in the Succah.

Breakfast in the Succah will be available during Chol Hamoed following each of the three weekday and Sunday morning services.

Hoshanah Rabbah October 17th

The fifth day of Chol Hamoed is called Hoshanah Rabbah. It is on this day that the decrees of Yom Kippur are sealed and the fate prescribed therein for each individual takes effect. In the time of the Temple a procession was made around the altar with the four species while the Hoshanah prayers were chanted. Seven circuits are made this day.

It is a custom to read portions of holy works and to study the Torah on the night of Hoshanah Rabbah.
