**HAMISHA ASAR B'SHEVAT
SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 5th**

Hamisha Asar B'Shevav (the fifteenth day of the Hebrew month Shevat) is the Jewish "Arbor Day."

In Temple times this day determined the dating of the produce relating to tithes. The Mishna refers to this day as Rosh Hashonah L'Ilanos (New Year for Trees).

Hamisha Asar B'Shevav is observed by the eating of fruit products for which the Holy Land is noted, such as dates, figs, olives, pomegranates, grapes, almonds and carob ("bokser"). We partake of one of these fruits, which we have not as yet eaten during the year, for the purpose of saying the blessing of "Shehechiyanu."

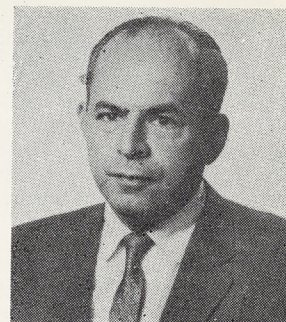
