LAG B'OMER SUNDAY

Sunday, May 8th, marks the 33rd day of the counting of the Omer and is known as Lag B'Omer, a minor holiday in the Jewish Calendar.

On Lag B'Omer Bar Kochba defeated the Romans in his unsuccessful revolt (132-35 C.E.). During that same period a plague broke out which raged among the disciples of Rabbi Akiba and ceased on Lag B'Omer.

Though it is in the "Sefirah" period, weddings and haircuts are permitted on Lag B'Omer. Inasmuch as this year Lag B'Omer falls on Sunday, it is also permissible to take a haircut on Friday, May 6th, in honor of the Sabbath.

FUNERAL PRACTICES

In time of tragedy it is comforting to be cognizant of the hallowed Jewish laws and traditions concerning the burial rites.

1. The deceased should be provided with a "Shomer", a religious attendant.
2. There must be no Sabbath violation in the preparations for the funeral, such as transporting the remains until the Sabbath ends.
3. There must be proper "taharah" or washing of the remains by religiously qualified persons.
4. The remains must be dressed in "tachrichim", traditional shrouds.
5. A simple wooden coffin should be used.
6. There should be no embalming or public viewing of the body.
7. Flowers and music are not permissible.
8. The law requires the "kreeah", a tear be made in the garment of the mourner. For this purpose a jacket, vest, sweater or dress should be worn. A "ribbon" does not satisfy the requirements of the law and should not be used.
9. The burial should take place as soon as possible after death.
10. The grave is to be filled at the funeral service.

The U.J.A. story this year is particularly serious. The United Jewish Appeal faces a crisis because so many extremely difficult problems have combined to aggravate an already difficult situation.

At the heart of the dilemma is the fact that the U.J.A. agencies have lost some \$17,500,000 in annual income with the end of German reparations payments. This loss comes at a time when the demand for the services of the agencies has not decreased at all but has increased in every area of the world; the number of people needing help is greater, the cost of transportation of an immigrant from his country of origin to Israel or another country has gone up; food and clothing prices have risen and so has the cost of the vital services provided by U.J.A.

In human terms the questions for 1966 are: Will we have to abandon

people . . . and if we do, how do we choose which ones will be passed over?
