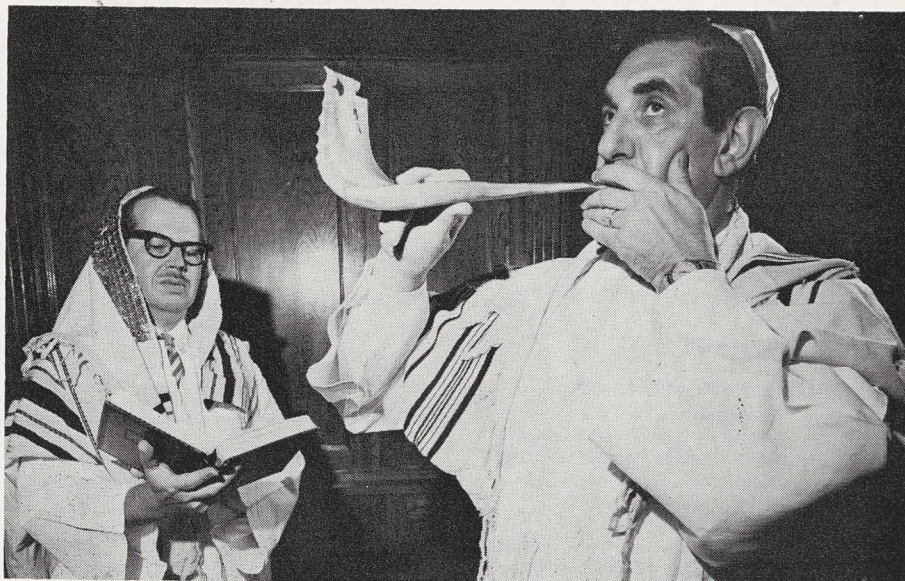

It is not permissible to cook or prepare food on one day of Yom Tov for the next day or for the Sabbath. The "Eruv Tavshilin" set aside prior to the Festival, enables the housewife to cook on Friday for the Sabbath. Inasmuch as this year Rosh

Challah (bread) and some cooked food are placed on a plate. The master of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ataw a-do-elo-kenu melech ha'olam asher kidshanu b'mitzvo-sav v'tzi-va-nu al mitzvahs e-ruv. — By virtue of this Eruv, be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath."

On Saturday afternoon one partakes of this food.

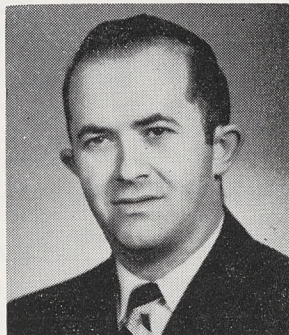
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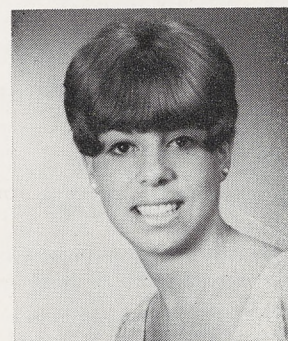

eaten in its season is placed on the table for the Shehecheyanu of the Kiddush which embraces also the fruit. It is customary to dip the Hamotzi in honey to denote a sweet year.

MUSSAF SERVICE

The Rosh Hashanah Mussaf Service is by far the longest Amidah in the Prayer Book. In the repetition of the Amidah by the Cantor, the sounding of the Shofar is repeated following the recitation of a series of Biblical quotations relating to: Malchiot — G-d's sovereignty over all the world; Zichronot — G-d as the supreme Judge; Shofrot — the sounding of the Shofar emphasizing our faith.

TASHLICH

Tashlich, a deeply symbolic tradition, takes place on the first day of Rosh Hashanah when we go to a body of water and resolve to free ourselves of our sins.

SHABBOS SHUVAH

The Sabbath following Rosh Hashanah is known as the Sabbath of Repentance because of the Haftarah chanted on this Sabbath from the Prophetic Book of Hosea which begins with the words SHUVA YISRAEL "Return (or repent) O Israel to thy G-d."

As is customary every year, Rabbi Reichel will deliver his Shabbos Shuva Halachic Discourse on Saturday afternoon after Mincha.

TZOHM GEDALIAH

The Day after Rosh Hashanah is a Fast Day in memory of Gedaliah ben Achikam who was appointed Jewish Governor of Israel by Nebuchadnezzar after he destroyed the First Temple. Gedaliah, however, was assassinated by his opponents and as a result all Jewish hope for self-government ended for a period of seventy

years — the Babylonian Exile. This year, Tzohm Gedaliah is postponed from Saturday to Sunday.

EREV YOM KIPPUR — FRI. OCT. 13

The Erev Yom Kippur mincha service precedes the final meal of that day. The "Al Chate" prayer of Yom Kippur is added to the Shmoneh Esray of Mincha. This Mincha service is usually found in the Yom Kippur Machzor. Successive Mincha services on Erev Yom Kippur are held in our Synagogue from 1:45 to 3:30 P.M.

YOM KIPPUR

With the solemn and melodious chanting of the ancient awe inspiring and pathos soaked prayer of Kol Nidre, Jews throughout the world will usher in Yom Kippur on Friday evening, October 13th.

The solemn Season of Repentance reaches its highest climax on Yom Kippur. On this day we are not only serious and sincere in our desire to repent but we have the strength of character to continue on the Righteous Path by depriving ourselves of bodily pleasure and life sustaining necessities such as food, drink, washing, and anointing of our bodies; wearing of leather shoes and other earthly pleasures. By "afflicting our souls" in this manner from sundown to the evening of the next day we prove that we have the stamina to remain faithful Jews throughout the year.
