What Is Chometz?

Wheat, rye, barley, spelt and oats in contact with water become chometz unless prepared according to Jewish law.

All vegetables and fruits may be used except rice, millet, peas and beans.

Search for Leaven

The search for leaven should be conducted with the entire household on Tuesday, April 1st, after sunset. In the accompanying blessings (found in most Haggadahs) we annul all leaven which we did not find during the search. The crumbs which were collected at night should be burned by 10:30 on Wednesday morning when the second "Kol Chamira" should be recited.

No matzoh may be eaten on Erev Pessach because we should eat matzoh at the Seder with appetite.

Sale of Chometz

Since we may not possess chometz on Passover it is necessary to transfer ownership of chometz before Passover, and to keep it out of bounds. Rabbi Pekier will be available for the sale of chometz during the hours of daily services until 9:30 Erev Pessach morning. For those who cannot come to the Synagogue the coupon may be used.

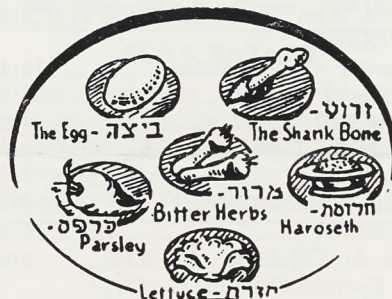

CONGREGATIONAL SEDER RESERVATIONS

Congregational Sedorim will be held at the Hotel Esplanade, West End Avenue and 74th Street. Rabbi Reichel will officiate on the first and Rabbi Riskin on the second night. The charge for each Seder is \$15.25. Checks should be made payable to "Esplanade Caterers," and mailed to our office by March 25th.



Kashering

Metal pots and pans can be kashered by first thoroughly cleaning them at least a day before, and then purging them in a vessel of boiling water. Utensils used directly over the fire may be kashered directly over the fire, allowing them to get red hot. Earthenware cannot be kashered.

The Synagogue facilities for kashering will be available on Sunday, March 30th, from 9:00 A.M. to noon.

Every part of the stove must be cleaned and heated to a glow. Special tin sheets are placed over the top of the range.

Fast of the First-Born

Every first born should fast on Erev Pessach, in thankfulness to G-d for having spared the first born of the Israelites when he smote those of the Egyptians. One may forego the fast if he participates in the "Siyum Bechorim" which takes place after the morning services.

Eruv Tavshilin Wednesday, April 2

A matzoh and some cooked food, such as fish or an egg are placed on a plate. The head of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ataw a-do---elo-kenu me-lech ha-olam asher kid-sha-nu b'mitz-vo-sav v'tzi-va-nu al mitzvas e-ruv . . . By virtue of this Eruv, be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath." On Saturday afternoon the food thus prepared may be eaten.

Counting of the Omer

The Counting of the Omer begins on the second night of Passover, Thursday, April 3rd, and continues each evening until Shevuos.

The "Omer" was a measure of barley which was offered at the Temple after which the Jews were permitted to eat the new harvest.

During this period of counting the Omer many tragedies occurred in latter times. Wedding celebrations and other joyous occasions involving music are avoided. A Rabbi should be consulted concerning those days when exceptions are made.
