The Shofar

One of the most significant and awe inspiring portions of the New Year Service is the sounding of the Shofar, or ram's horn. As the Shofar is not sounded on the Sabbath, it will be heard only on Sunday this year.

Tashlich

A moving and deeply symbolic ritual, known as Tashlich, takes place on Rosh Hashonah when we go to a body of water and resolve to free ourselves of our sins. The word is derived from the Hebrew of the first word of the verse, "And thou shalt cast all thy sins into the depths of the sea." When the first day of the Holiday is on Saturday, as this year, the ceremony will be observed on Sunday.

Shabbos Shuvah

The Sabbath following Rosh Hashonah is known as the Sabbath of Repentance because of the Haftorah chanted on this Sabbath from the Prophetic Book of Hosea which begins with the words, SHUVAH YISRAEL, "Return (or repent) O Israel to the L-rd, thy G-d."

As is customary every year, Rabbi Reichel will deliver his Shabbos Shuvah Halachic Discourse after Minchah.

Erev Yom Kippur — Sun., Sept. 21

The Erev Yom Kippur Minchah service precedes the final meal of that day. The "Al Chate" prayer of Yom Kippur is added to the Shmoneh Esray of Minchah (this service is found in the

Yom Kippur machzor). Successive Minchah services on Erev Yom Kippur are conducted at our Synagogue from 1:45 to 3:30 P.M.

Yom Kippur

The solemn Season of Repentance reaches its highest climax on Yom Kippur. On this day we are not only serious and sincere in our desire to repent but we have the strength of character to continue on the Righteous Path by depriving ourselves of bodily pleasure and life sustaining necessities such as food, drink, washing, and anointing of our bodies; wearing of leather shoes and other earthly pleasures. By "afflicting our souls" in this manner from sundown to the evening of the next day we prove that we have the stamina to remain faithful Jews throughout the year.

Reminder: Bring non-leather footwear for Yom Kippur.

On Friday eve, September 26, we usher in the Festival of Tabernacles. Following the solemn High Holidays, contrast, a time of joyous celebration. The keynote of its observance is as expressed in the phrase "Vesamachtaw Bechagechaw". (And thou shalt rejoice in thy festival).
