JOEL'S BAR MITZVAH — A TALE OF OUR TOWN

Let me tell you about New York. Let me tell you about a city that's so hard its storekeepers won't even give you two fives for a 10. Let me tell you about Joel Charap and the people who bar-mitzvahed him on Saturday.

Of course, you knew Joel's father, Sidney. Sidney was the blind newsdealer on the corner of 72nd and Columbus, except that probably you didn't know he was blind. "Sidney?" you can still hear his friends say, "Sidney had a way of seeing even without his eyesight. The way he counted money and made change, his customers couldn't tell."

Judy Garland used to be one of Sidney's customers, Jason Robards Jr. would get his papers at Sidney's newsstand and Ted Lewis's friends. They still talk about the day that Walter Matthau stood on the sidewalk for two hours just to have a conversation with Sidney, but then Sidney had a personality. "He had a very strong personality," his son Ross will tell you. "Working at the newsstand with my father taught me how to speak to people and be a man."

He Had to Last

Sidney was a postal employee when he went blind from diabetes eight years ago. He moved down from the Bronx with his wife and two children and took a two-room flat on 72nd St. so he could operate the newsstand. Then he developed a vein disease which normally took two years to kill a person, but Sidney had a pair of sons to bring up, and so he lived for five. Even the doctor at Flower Fifth Ave. Hospital said he had never seen anyone last as long as Sidney did.

Sidney was 50. It wasn't until Ross had won a full scholarship to Columbia University that Sidney told one of his friends, "Now I know he'll be all right." Three weeks later Sidney's Seeing-Eye dog died. "I'm worried," he said a few days later. "I can hear the dog calling me." By the end of the week, Sidney was dead. What he left was the newsstand, two children and a wife who already had had a breast removed because of cancer.

Sidney's wife was named Gerry. After her operation, she couldn't work at the newsstand much. The Cancer Care People sent a woman to help out and Ross operated the newsstand. Most of Sidney's pensions died with him but the Jewish Family Service helped and then there were the meager profits of the business. "We've never made much there, but it's kept us off welfare," Ross will tell you. "My father gave us a great sense of pride."

And what about Joel? He grew up pudgy, quiet and studious, with thick

eyeglasses and a serious face, living in a cramped apartment where everything had to be kept in its place, even after his father died. Try to talk to Joel, and he won't tell you much. His mother tried to plan for his bar mitzvah. G-d knows how, but she saved up a little money for it, at least enough to buy him a new suit at Barney's and four trays of cold cuts, catered by the delicatessen down the street. She didn't make it, of course. She died two weeks ago yesterday. She was 49.

The Haftarah of Noah

At the West Side Institutional Synagogue on 76th St. Saturday, Joel heard the chant of the cantor. "Stand up, oh bar mitzvah boy, come and sing your haftarah." Have you ever seen a boy on his bar mitzvah day? He comes with a face which has never looked so clean. Even his pimples and blemishes disappear. His cheeks are flushed and his visage glows and he walks to the altar brimming with the stuff that halos are made of. Joel had been receiving instruction since March, free of charge, from Rabbi Moshe Pekier. On this particular Saturday of the liturgy it was his lot to sing from the "... For I have sworn that the waters of Noah should no more go over the earth; so have I sworn that I would not be wroth with thee, nor rebuke thee ... For the mountains shall depart and the hills be removed; but my kindness shall not depart from thee, neither shall the covenant of my peace be removed ..."

Rabbi O. Asher Reichel gave the sermon. "G-d has some way that no man can understand," he said, looking at Joel, who stood alone at the altar. "I don't want to talk too much about your flood, Joel." The sermon was short. In the congregation were Whayong Kim, who is Joel's best friend, and Alfred Lopez, who is in Joel's eighth grade class at William J. O'Shea Junior HS, and Mary Myerson, who is Joel's homeroom teacher.

No One Saw

Afterward, there was the party in the two-room flat, brimming with people from the family and from the neighborhood. Yesterday, there was another party in Miss Myerson's apartment with 16 of Joel's classmates. Two of the girls baked cakes. One made peanut brittle. What's Joel going to do now? His older brother, Ross, is only 20 and still has to finish college. At 13, Joel is going to live with a friend in New Rochelle. "What can I do?" the friend said. "I grew up with Sidney. Before he died, he made me promise."

Joel understands about New York. He understands that you can't break a 10 for a stranger when you need the change for your customers. He understands the

need to have boys with names like Alfred Lopez and Whayong Kim wearing yarmulkes and prayer shawls at your bar mitzvah. He understands why you must face New York with the same mask it wears for you. When the rabbi spoke to him at his bar mitzvah Saturday, he was crying but no one saw his tears. "What I was thinking about," he said, "was what the rabbi was saying and how true it was."

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POSTSCRIPT

The heart touching story as witnessed by our congregants at the Bar Mitzvah service as well as read by thousands of New York Post readers (as printed above) brought forth not only tears and a feeling of compassion, but also a warm response of gifts. Accordingly, our Synagogue will endeavor to establish a Scholarship Fund for Joel. You can help to make this a reality by sending your gift to the WSIS.

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First Chanukah Candle Thursday Evening, December 4**The Order in Lighting****The Chanukah Menorah**

The first candle is placed at the extreme right of the Menorah. Each night following, an additional candle is placed to the left of the previous one. However, the order of lighting the candles is from left to right — so that the added candle is kindled first.

On Friday, we light the Chanukah candles *before* the Sabbath candles; on Saturday night the Chanukah candles are kindled *after* Havdalah is made.

Benedictions Over the Candles

Baruch a-tah ado . . . elo-ke-nu me-lech ha-olom a-sheer kid-sha-nu be-mitzvo-sav v'tziva-nu l'had-lik ner shel Cha-nukah.

Baruch a-tah ado . . . elo-ke-nu me-lech ha-olam she-assah ni-sim l'a-vo-se-nu ba-yamim ha-hem baz-man ha-zeh.

This blessing is recited only on the first kindling:

Baruch a-tah ado . . . elo-ke-nu me-lech ha-olam she-he-che-ya-nu v'eki-yema-nu vehi-gi-a-nu laz-man hazeh.



Beginning with Thursday night, December 4th, Chanukah will be celebrated in Jewish homes and Synagogues eight days.

This festival commemorates one of the major turning points in Jewish history. In the year 168 B.C.E., the Syrian Emperor Antiochus Epiphanus launched a campaign of religious persecution against the Jews. His soldiers likewise desecrated the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. For three years Judah the Maccabee led a valiant army of loyal followers against the mighty Syrian legions. After routing the enemy hordes, they rededicated the Holy Temple and reestablished the traditional worship. This consecration was celebrated for eight days. To this day we kindle Chanukah lamps to celebrate not only the events of the hoary past but also as a symbol of the Almighty's mighty deeds throughout the ages.
