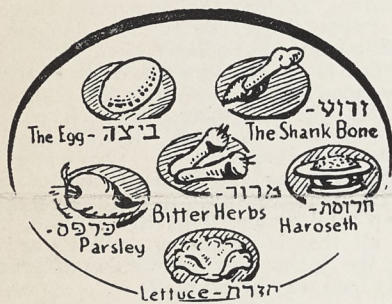

PASSOVER NOTES

SEDER PLATE



Shabbos Hagadol

The Sabbath before Passover is called "Shabbos Hagadol" or the Great Sabbath. At the Minchah service we read a part of the Passover Hagadah. Rabbi Reichel will deliver a discourse on laws relating to the Festival at the morning service.

What is Chometz?

Wheat, rye, barley, spelt and oats in contact with water become chometz unless prepared according to Jewish law. All vegetables and fruits may be used except rice, millet, peas and beans.

Kashering

Metal pots and pans can be kashered by first thoroughly cleaning them at least a day before, and then purging them in a vessel of boiling water. Utensils used directly over the fire may be kashered directly over the fire, allowing them to get red hot. Earthenware cannot be kashered.

The Synagogue facilities for kashering will be available on Sunday, March 26th, from 9:00 A.M. to noon.

Every part of the stove must be cleaned and heated to a glow. Special tin sheets are placed over the top of the range.

Sale of Chometz

Since we may not possess chometz on Passover it is necessary to transfer ownership of chometz before Passover out of bounds. Rabbi Pekier will be available for the sale of chometz during the hours of daily services and until 9:00 Erev Pessach morning. For those who cannot come to the Synagogue the coupon may be used.

Search for Leaven

The search for leaven should be conducted with the entire household on Tuesday, March 28th, after sunset, when we annul all leaven which we did not find during the search. The crumbs which were collected at night should be burned by 10:30 on the morrow when the second "Kol Chamira" should be recited.

No matzoh may be eaten on Erev Pessach because we should eat matzoh at the Seder with appetite.

Fast of the First-Born

Every first born should fast on Erev Pessach, in thankfulness to G-d for having spared the first born of the Israelites when he smote those of the Egyptians. One may forego the fast if he participates in the "Siyum Bechorim" which takes place after the morning services.

Festival Notes (Cont'd)**Eruv Tavshilin Wed., March 29**

It is not permissible to cook, bake or prepare food on one day of Yom Tov for the next day or for the Sabbath. The "Eruv Tavshilin" set aside prior to the Festival, enables the housewife to cook on Friday Yom Tov for the Sabbath.

A matzah and some cooked food, such as fish or an egg are placed on a plate. The head of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ata a-do---elo-kenu me-lech ha-olam asher kid'sha-nu bemitzvo-sav vetzi-vanu al mitzvas e-ruv . . . By virtue of this Eruv, be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath." On Saturday afternoon this food may be eaten.

Counting of the Omer

The Counting of the Omer begins on the second night of Passover, and continues each evening until Shavuot. The "Omer" was a measure of barley which was offered at the Temple after which the Jews were permitted to eat the new harvest.

During the period of counting the Omer many tragedies occurred. Thus weddings and other celebrations involving music are avoided. There are special days exempt from the prohibition.

Shir HaShirim

On Saturday Chol Hamoed the Biblical book, "Song of Songs," is chanted preceding the reading of the Torah. This series of songs by King Solomon are a poetic illustration of the love of G-d for His people, Israel.

Chometz After Passover

Chometz products in the possession of a Jew during Passover are considered "chometz she-avar alav ha-Pesach" — prohibited products held during Passover. We are not permitted to derive any benefit from such products. At the conclusion of Passover, one should not use any Jewish baked products until we are certain that the products have been freshly baked.

We set aside this Lechem Oni, matzoh of oppression, to remember our three million brethren in the Soviet Union, most of whom cannot observe the mitzvah of matzoh tonight. Nor can they freely teach their children the heritage of their fathers.

Our voices shall be joined by men of conscience aroused by the injustice imposed on Soviet Jews. Then shall they know they have not been forgotten, and they that sit in darkness shall yet see a great light.
