SHAVUOS NOTES



On Thursday evening, May 18th, the fiftieth day following the second day of Passover, we usher in the Festival of Shavuos, the Feast of Weeks. This Holiday is of great significance in the Jewish calendar, for on this day we received the Torah on Mt. Sinai. It is therefore known as "Zman Matan Torasenu", the season of the giving of our Torah.

To commemorate this divine event we decorate our Synagogue with leaves and flowers reminiscent of the greenery atop Mt. Sinai. Our Women's League will again provide the floral decorations for our Shavuos services.

Another hallowed tradition is the "Mishmar," the all night vigil in the Synagogue and reciting "Tikun Shavuos," selections from the Bible and Mishnah and other sacred writings. Our readers are cordially invited to join us in the Synagogue beginning at 10:15 o'clock on Thursday night. Refreshments will be served. The morning service for those who are awake the whole night is held at daybreak, 4:30 o'clock.

It is a tradition to eat dairy foods on this festival. One reason given is that the Torah has been likened to "milk and honey."

During the morning services of the first day we read from the Torah the Ten Commandments and chant the Akdamos, a beautiful poem in Aramaic, in adoration of the Almighty and the Torah.

On the second day, the idyllic story of Ruth is read. This is to commemorate the Yahrzeit of King David who was descended from Ruth.

SAYINGS OF THE FATHERS

On the Sabbaths during the summer season we recite *Pirkei Avos* (Sayings of the Fathers) in the afternoon. These chapters from the Mishnah contain some of the most pithy moral philosophy known to man. All are invited to listen to Rabbi Reichel's comments on the *Pirkei Avos* following the Sabbath minchah services.

Eruv Tavshilin, Thursday, May 18

It is not permissible to cook, bake or prepare food on one day of Yom Tov for the next day or for the Sabbath. The "Eruv Tavshilin" set aside prior to the Festival, enables the housewife to cook on Friday Yom Tov for the Sabbath.

Challah, bread or matzah and some cooked food, such as fish or an egg are placed on a plate. The head of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ata a-do---elo-kenu me-lech ha-olam asher kid'sha-nu bemitzvo-sav vetzivanu al mitzvas e-ruv . . . By virtue of this Eruv, be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath." On Saturday afternoon this food may be eaten.

A SURVEY OF JEWISH HISTORY

SURA AND PUMBEDITHA

The intellectual activity of the Babylonian Jews did not culminate with the completion of the Talmud. For many centuries, both the academies, Pumbeditha and Sura, were the centers of Jewish learning not only of the East but of all Jewry. Their scholars, the GEONIM, were the established authorities of Judaism.

When Islam conquered the Orient in the middle of the seventh century, it recognized the Jewish religion and gave the Jews all the rights they had enjoyed under the most tolerant Persian rulers. Besides intensive Talmudic study, the learning concentrated on Bible exegesis and grammar. These studies were furthered by the struggle against the Karaites, the followers of Anan ben David (800), who struck out against the hallowed oral tradition of the Talmud and sought to explain the Bible by independent interpretation.

The counterpart of the conflict between the Karaites and the Rabbanites (followers of Rabbinic Judaism) was the struggle between the Shi'ites, enemies of the oral tradition of Islam, and the Sunnites, its adherents.

During these centuries, Pumbeditha and Sura remained the fortresses of Talmudic study and their ranks of scholars were kept intact.

SAADYA

A new phase in more than one sense began in Jewish history with the appointment to the Gaonate of Sura, of Saadya ben Joseph of Fayum (892-942). The fact that he was an Egyptian scholar suggested that the supremacy of Babylonia had ended. His appointment (in spite of the political difficulties with the Exilarch, head of the Jews in Babylonia) instituted another glorious period of the academy which Rav had founded.

Unlike the Alexandrian Jews who had lost their Jewish identity, the Jews of Bagdad, on the whole, remained steadfast to Judaism. Centuries of Talmudic schooling gave them an entirely different

perspective of the situation than Philo had had.

Through his EMMUNOTH V'DEOTH, Saadya became the philosophical leader of his contemporaries and of many generations after him. To us he is the prototype of the Talmudically educated philosopher, who did not seek to compromise but rather to synthesize faith and knowledge. Saadya cannot be considered an isolated Jewish scholar; when he wrote his work in Arabic, it became most evident how closely the Jewish-Babylonian intellectual world had allied itself with Arabic culture.

Since the spiritual supremacy of Babylonia was declining, while Spain among all the lands under the sway of Islam was gradually taking its place, it was fortunate that the philosophical studies of the Jews began on old Talmudic ground, represented by Saadya. Saturated with Talmudic thought and feeling, the Jewish people could take their place in the spiritual life of the nations, and in turn show the way toward G-d in the realm of the mind as well as in ethics.
