Jewish Writers Make Carmen

First Class Story

By Alexander Rauchman

"Bizet's music in *Carmen* is delicate and exquisite. Carmen is one of the best operas in the world. It is a masterpiece; every single number is perfectly written. It is a first class story." These words were written by Sir Thomas Beecham some thirty years ago in the New York Times. Beecham probably would never have made these remarks were it not for the influence of two Jewish writers of the libretto: Ludovic Halevy and Henri Meilhac who adapted the story (which will be outlined in the coming REVIEW by Mr. Herman H. Cohen) from a novel by Prosper Merimee. It was Ludovic Halevy who was most persistent in changing the cloak and dagger and immoral portrayal of characters of the original story. Current biographies omit the major contributing factor for this story change of Halevy.

Of special interest is that Ludovic Halevy's uncle, Fromental Halevy (composer of the Opera *La Juive*) compiled and published in 1847 the *Zemiroth Yisrael* containing complete services for the entire cycle of the year and arranged the book for *chazzan* and choir. In 1865, four years before his daughter Genevieve married Bizet, he composed *Célebres Chants Religieux Des Israelites*.

There was one attempt to stage the Merimee *Carmen* and that was by the Moscow Art Theatre music Studio in 1923 as "Carmencita and The Soldier." The Russian version upheld Nietzsche's view of Carmen. The W.S.I.S. Benefit Performance of *Carmen* on March 3rd, 1973, at Lincoln Center by the New York City Opera, will mark the exact 98th Anniversary of its first performance on March 3, 1875 at the Paris Opera Comique. This should be a great event for the W.S.I.S. for it will be celebrating with opera companies all over the world.

The Halachah:

Unmistakably, however, the Talmud and the halachah were the basis of all this Jewish culture. The Jewish learning which manifested itself in so many fields was indissolubly united with the study and the tradition of Sura and Pumbeditha. The towering figure of R. Isaac Alfasi (1012-1103) rises before us, even above the titans of his time. Because of his sovereign knowledge of the Talmud in all breadth and depth, he was able to form for the Jewish people an extract of the "sea of the Talmud" which has become one of the most vital factors in halachic study.

The intellectual power of Spanish Judaism of this period is epitomized in the personality of R. Moses ben Maimon, known as "Rambam" (1135-1204). Prepared with a most thorough knowledge of Talmudic tradition and the Arabic culture of his time, and above all blessed with the keenness of mind which only the most select of humanity are endowed with, he became the greatest codifier of the Halachah. He was able to form this gigantic work into an organic whole, penetrating into its finest details, and yet remaining aware and appreciative of the unity of the whole. Since the Talmud, the Jewish people have never been blessed with a work of the magnitude of Mishneh Torah. Never had a Jewish thinker defined the boundaries between religion and philosophy in so systematic a manner as the author of the "Guide to the Perplexed." (Still, at times, the number of opponents of the "Moreh" was greater than the number of its friends.) Yet, in spite and because of these conflicts in all parts of the Jewish world, the "Guide" (Moreh) has remained the most valuable incentive for discussing the

problem of the relation of the Jews to G-d's law and that of the religious man to his G-d.

France and Germany:

While Spanish Jewry very obviously owed much to its fortunate political position, the most active period of cultural life for the Jews in northern France and Germany proceeded under the stress of brutal persecution. It is due to this fact, as well as to the cultural stagnation of the Christian nations of the Middle Ages, that the Jews of northern France and Germany were influenced very little by their neighbors. Thus they concentrated their efforts on the study of the Bible and the Talmud to a far greater extent than did their brethren in Spain.

Tortured by ruthless persecutors, threatened and abused by crazed mobs, the German and French Jews of the middle Ages found it a spiritual and intellectual refuge to lock themselves up lovingly within the treasure house of Torah and Talmud. They enriched these treasures greatly by their incomparable devotion to study. What these thousands of scholars accomplished through centuries of persecution is hardly paralleled in the history of the world's literature. They explored the whole breadth of the Talmud; they descended into the depths of Jewish tradition and brought to life the most beautiful teachings of G-d's Law.

FUNERAL PRACTICES

In time of tragedy it is comforting to be cognizant of the hallowed Jewish laws and traditions concerning the burial rites:

1. The deceased should be provided with a "Shomer", a religious attendant.
2. There must be no Sabbath violation in the preparations for the funeral, such as transporting the remains, until the Sabbath ends.
3. There must be proper "taharah" or washing of the remains by religiously qualified persons.
4. The remains must be dressed in "tachrichim," traditional shrouds.

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ACADEMIC NOTES

High school students who plan to attend out-of-town colleges, should take into special consideration the many campuses that have kosher kitchen facilities. 5. A simple wooden coffin should be used.
6. There should be no embalming or public viewing of the body.
7. Flowers and music are not permissible.
8. The law requires "kreeah", a tear, be made in the garment of the mourner, such as a jacket, vest, sweater or dress. A "ribbon" does not satisfy the requirements of the law and should not be used.
9. The burial should take place as soon as possible after death.
10. The grave is to be filled at the funeral service.
