PUBLICATION OF RABBI REICHEL'S NEW BOOK

TO BE CELEBRATED SATURDAY MORNING, DECEMBER 16

Professor Sidney B. Hoenig to be Guest Speaker

The prestigious religious publishing institute in Jerusalem, Mossad Harav Kook, has just published a new volume in Hebrew by our Rabbi, Dr. O. Asher Reichel, entitled *IGGEROT RABBI YITZHAK ISAAC HALEVY*. It is a companion to his previous book, *ISAAC HALEVY (1947-1914): SPOKESMAN AND HISTORIAN OF JEWISH TRADITION*, a biography published by Yeshiva University in 1969. This volume contains never-before published letters of Rabbi Halevy which confirm his remarkable accomplishments in founding the international religious movement, Agudath Israel, as well as his unique role in modern Orthodox scholarship. The new volume is the thirty-fourth in the Jakob Michael Library, a collection of works in classic Jewish studies.

FROM "JEWISH LIFE"

Who is Rabbi Isaac Halevy? There are so many very learned people who have never heard his name. Some people know that he wrote a profound historical work, *Doroth Harishonim*, but very few have bothered to read or study it. Quite unknown is the fact that he was the founder of the Agudath Israel World Organization and its spiritus rector.

We therefore have to be deeply thankful to Rabbi Reichel for his book on Isaac Halevy which gives a clear idea of the greatness of this outstanding personality . . .

For Isaac Halevy, the study of history, in the same way as that of the Torah, was not merely a scholarly endeavor but intended for life. His penetrating understanding of the past endowed him with a deep insight into future developments. This led to his plan of an organization of the Jewish people, whose life was based on the Torah and which should represent the Jewish people before the world. This was his idea of Agudath Yisroel. He succeeded in gathering the Torah authorities of his time, who recognized him as a gaon, to join hands in order to establish this organization. Even the name was conceived by him. When unfortunately he passed away in 1914, he was rightly eulogized as the soul of Agudath Yisroel . . .
