What is Chometz?

Wheat, rye, barley, spelt and oats in contact with water become chometz unless prepared according to Jewish law. All vegetables and fruits may be used except rice, millet, peas and beans. If in doubt ask the Rabbi.

Kashering

Metal pots and pans can be kashered by first thoroughly cleaning them at least a day before, and then purging them in a vessel of boiling water. Utensils used directly over the fire may be kashered directly over the fire, allowing them to get red hot. Earthenware cannot be kashered.

The Synagogue facilities for kashering will be available on Sunday, April 15th from 9:00 A.M. to noon.

Every part of the stove must be cleaned and heated to a glow. Special tin sheets are placed over the top of the range.

Search for Leaven

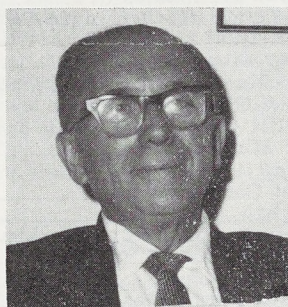
The search for leaven should be conducted with the entire household on Sunday, April 15th, after sunset, when we annul all leaven which we did not find during the search. The crumbs which were collected at night should be burned by 10:30 on the morrow when the second "Kol Chamira" should be recited.

No matzoh may be eaten on Erev Pessach because we should eat matzoh at the Seder with appetite.

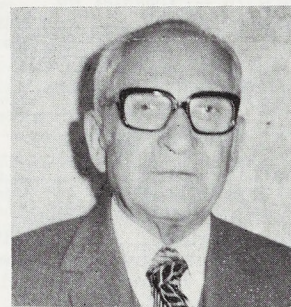

Counting of the Omer

The Counting of the Omer begins on the second night of Passover, and continues each evening until Shavuot. The "Omer" was a measure of barley which was offered at the Temple after which the Jews were permitted to eat the new harvest.

During the period of counting the Omer many tragedies occurred. Thus weddings and other celebrations involving music are avoided. There are special days exempt from the prohibition.

On Saturday Chol Hamoed the Biblical book, "Song of Songs," is chanted preceding the reading of the Torah. This series of songs by King Solomon are a poetic illustration of the love of G-d for His people, Israel.

Chometz After Passover

Chometz products in the possession of a Jew during Passover are considered "chometz she-avar alav ha-Pesach" — prohibited products held during Passover. We are not permitted to derive any benefit from such products. At the conclusion of Passover, one should not use any Jewish baked products until we are certain that the products have been freshly baked.

A SURVEY OF JEWISH HISTORY by Dr. Moses Auerbach (13)

Lands of Refuge:

While the German Jews were never actually driven out from their homeland, the persecutions of the Crusades and the slaughter of the Jews at the time of the Black Death drove thousands of them towards the East where they settled in Poland. Because of the favorable conditions and the autonomy Polish Jewry enjoyed, there developed not only prosperous individual communities but also a strong powerful organization of Rabbis, the "Four-Lands-Synod," which became the authoritative body in settling all questions for the Jews of Poland. Since the time of the Gaonim of Babylonia the Jews of no land of the Diaspora had enjoyed such well-organized self-government.

Just as in the land between the Tigris and Euphrates, now too the study of the Torah again attracted the interest of the whole people. There now arose the giants of the Talmud, such as R. Moses ben Isserles, the "Rama," and R. Solomon Luria, the "Marshal." Despite dreadful incidents, such as the horrible Cossack persecutions of 1648 which is said to have claimed 600,000 victims, Poland remained the great center of Jewish life and learning for centuries.

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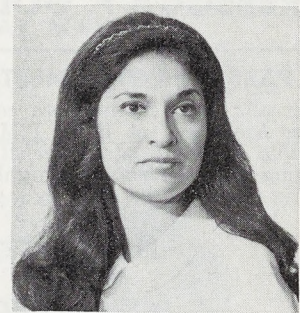
