A SURVEY OF JEWISH HISTORY

A New Era: The dawning of a new era first appeared to the Jews in Holland. The Dutch people who had themselves been freed from the Spanish Inquisition after a hard struggle gave shelter to the Marranos who had fled from Spain and Portugal at the end of the 16th century. In addition to the Sephardic immigrants, refugees from the Thirty Year's War and the Cossack massacres came from Germany and Poland.

The community of Amsterdam soon became one of the most important in all Jewry. But there was lacking the traditional certainty of *emunah* in certain quarters. Thus a man like Baruch Spinoza with his brilliant talents and lofty ethics could become so estranged from Judaism that the College of Rabbis found it necessary to excommunicate him from the community. On the other hand an outstanding member of the Amsterdam community, Menasseh ben Israel (1604-57), prepared the way for the return of the Jews to England.

Sabbatai Zevi: A deep sense of mystical ardor possessed a large portion of the Jews in the latter half of the 17th century. The suffering brought on by the atrocities of the Cossacks were excellent soil on which to plant the soaring hopes for release—and thus arose Sabbatai Zevi (1650), the false Messiah of Smyrna, and his false prophets. Even distinguished scholars temporarily allowed themselves to be misled. However, when Sabbatai accepted Mohammedanism in order to save his life under the threats of the Sultan, the fraud was generally recognized.

Chassidism:

It was the fear of another Sabbatai debacle that led to the powerful struggle of some of the foremost Rabbinical leaders against Chassidism close to a hundred years later. The rise of Chassidism may be considered a gigantic upheaval of the slumbering emotional "tyranny" of the intellect. With glowing enthusiasm, Rabbi Israel Baal Shem Tove, the "*Besht*" (born 1700), emphasized the value of prayer and the mystical effacement of one's self in the image of G-d. His advent came as an emancipation to those who could not find complete satisfaction solely in intensive study.

The Chassidic movement never veered away from Talmud and Halachah; it avoided all uncontrolled mysticism and recognized essential discipline in all areas. That there were potential dangers

REPRINTED FROM "JEWISH PRESS"

"The American Jewish Congress has no right to make us the Uncle Toms of modern society. Orthodox Jewish women are not oppressed and have never solicited the American Jewish Congress to serve as their spokesman or their advocate for liberation," charged Mrs. Josephine Reichel, president of the Agudah Women of America. "We are neither slaves nor second-class citizens and we do not need any self-styled abolitionists to plead for our freedom."

Mrs. Reichel's statement came in response to a speech delivered by Mrs. Naomi Levine, executive director of the American Jewish Congress, at the convention of the National Women's Division of the Congress in Washington D.C. (as reported in the New York Times, March 27). Mrs. Levine said that "it is time for a new Talmud to be written . . . to meet contemporary conditions . . . to raise our status in the Jewish community."

The AJC leader assumed the right to speak for Orthodox women even though she is not a practicing Orthodox Jewess, because, "I am not black but I am concerned with inequities that blacks suffer. I am not Orthodox but Orthodox law affects us all as Jews and as women. We

can no longer accept the status of second-class citizens."

Mrs. Reichel charged "Not only is the AJC's uncalled-for advocacy demeaning, it betrays a terrible ignorance of women's key role in traditional Judaism. Officially I only speak on behalf of the women associated with Agudah Israel, but I know that I express the sentiments of all Orthodox women when I say that the Talmud is as sacred to us as is the written law. It takes the needs and dignity of women into account with far more sensitivity and understanding than any human document possibly could. It neither needs re-writing or replacement, nor could such a redaction ever take place.

"I would suggest that the American Jewish Congress limit its advocacy to the rights of those who are truly oppressed and in need of its help. If the AJC sincerely cares about the problems of Orthodox women let them join us in our concern for the welfare of future generations. Let them join us in advocating more government help to our financially-stricken day schools, where our children are being educated with national and moral responsibility, instead of obstructing our path with lawsuits and other 20th century blood libels against Jewish children."
