Rosh Hashanah Eve

As with every Festival, Kiddush is recited over the wine and Shehecheyanu is added. On the second night, a new fruit which has not yet been eaten in its season is placed on the table for the Shehecheyanu of the Kiddush which embraces also the fruit. It is customary to dip the Hamotzi in honey to denote a sweet year.

The Shofar

One of the awe inspiring portions of the New Year service is the sounding of the Shofar, the ram's horn calling to penitence. Mr. Nash Aussenberg will again blow the Shofar.

Tashlich

A moving and deeply symbolic ritual known as Tashlich takes place on Rosh Hashanah when we go to a body of water and resolve to free ourselves of our sins. The word is derived from *Micah*, "And you shalt cast all your sins into the depths of the sea."

Shabbas Shuvah

The Sabbath following Rosh Hashanah is known as the Sabbath of Repentance because of the Haftarah chanted on this Sabbath from the Prophetic Book of Hosea which begins with the words, SHUVAH YISRAEL, "Return (or repent) O Israel to thy G-d."

As is customary every year, Rabbi Reichel will deliver the Shabbos Shuvah Halachic Discourse after Minchah.

Erev Yom Kippur — Sun., Oct. 5

The Erev Yom Kippur Minchah service precedes the final meal of that day. The "Al Chate" prayer of Yom Kippur is added to the Shmoneh Essray (see Yom Kippur machzor). Successive Minchah services on Erev Yom Kippur are conducted at our Synagogue from 2:00 to 3:30 P.M.

reaches its highest climax on Yom Kippur. On this day we must be sincere in our desire to repent and observe the Biblical command of depriving ourselves of food, drink, washing, and anointing of our bodies; wearing of leather shoes and other earthly pleasures.

Reminder: Bring non-leather footwear for Yom Kippur.

Eruv Tavshilin

It is not permissible to cook or prepare food on one day of Yom Tov for the next or for the Sabbath. The "Eruv Tavshilin" set aside prior to the Festival, enables the housewife to cook on Friday for the Sabbath. Inasmuch as this year Rosh Hashanah will be on Thursday and Friday, the ceremony of Eruv Tavshilin should be performed on Wednesday, Erev Yom Tov.

Challah (bread) and some cooked food are placed on a plate. The head of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ataw a-do . . . elo-kenu melech ha'olam asher kid-shanu b'mitzvo-sav v'tzi-va-nu al mitzvas Eruv . . . By virtue of this Eruv, be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and to all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath." On Saturday afternoon one partakes of this food.
