SEDER PLATE

What is Chometz?

Wheat, rye, barley, spelt and oats in contact with water become chometz unless prepared according to Jewish law. All vegetables and fruits may be used except rice, millet, peas and beans.

If in doubt ask the Rabbi.

Kashrus Directory

A guide to Passover foods published by the © is available free of charge in our Synagogue office.

Kashering

Metal pots and pans can be kashered by first thoroughly cleaning them at least a day before, and then purging them in a vessel of boiling water. Utensils used directly over the fire may be kashered directly over the fire, allowing them to get red hot. Earthenware cannot be kashered.

The Synagogue facilities for kashering will be available on Thursday, April 4th from 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M.

Every part of the stove must be cleaned and heated to a glow. Special tin sheets are placed over the top of the range.

Sale of Chometz

Since we may not possess *chometz* on Passover it is necessary to transfer ownership of *chometz* before Passover out of bounds. Rabbi Pekier will be available for the sale of *chometz* during the hours of daily services. For those who cannot come to the Synagogue the coupon may be used.

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Fast of the First-Born

The fast of the first-born, which is usually observed on Erev Pessach, in thankfulness to G-d for having spared the first-born of the Israelites in Egypt, will be observed this year on Thursday, April 4th. One may forego the fast if he participates in the "Siyum Bechorim" which takes place after the Thursday morning services.

Bedikas Chometz

The ritual searching for chometz, with the aid of a candle light, is ordinarily performed the night before the first Seder. This year it will be observed on Thursday evening, April 4th. The crumbs collected should be burned on Friday morning by 11:30. The chometz must be sold by Friday morning. The second "Kol Chamira" is said Saturday morning before 11:30.

Shabbos Hagadol

The Saturday before Passover is called "Shabbos Hagadol" or the Great Sabbath. This year the Sabbath morning service will be held at 7:45 o'clock (see section below relating to the Sabbath morning meal). At the Minchah service we read a part of the Passover Hagadah. Rabbi Reichel will deliver a discourse on laws relating to the Festival, following Minchah. He will also discuss some pertinent aspects of Pessach on the Saturday morning before.

Sabbath Meals Erev Passover

Since it is not permissible to make preparations on the Sabbath for the following day, even if it be for a Yom Tov, this year one has to make the house Pessachdig on Friday. All foods prepared on Friday should be Pessachdig, in Pessachdig utensils of course.

On Friday evening and Saturday morning, one may use Pessachdig egg matzah in place of challah and say the regular grace after meals. (On Saturday regular matzah should not be eaten until the Seder at night.) For those who wish to use challah instead of egg matzah for Hamotzi, smaller ones, kept away from the Pessachdig areas, should suffice. Our Saturday morning services will begin at 7:45 and be completed before 10:00 so that the Hamotzi for the Sabbath meal, if it be challah, can be

consumed by 10:17. On Saturday morning all the remaining chometz should be flushed down the drain before the "Kol Chamira," which should be recited by 11:30 A.M.

Since it is required to eat three meals on Shabbos, the third meal (Seudah Shlishis) should consist of fruit, vegetables or fish, without any matzah. It should be a very light repast so that we may look forward with anticipation to eating the matzah in the evening.

Seder preparations may not be made before the termination of the Sabbath. Please note that the egg matzah, recommended for Friday and Saturday morning only, is not meant for the mitzvah of matzah nor is it generally used on Passover.

Counting of the Omer

The Counting of the Omer begins on the second night of Passover, and continues each evening until Shavuot. The "Omer" was a measure of barley which was offered at the Temple after which we were permitted to eat the new harvest.

During the period of counting the Omer, many tragedies occurred. Thus weddings and other celebrations involving music are avoided. There are special days exempt from the prohibition.

Chometz After Passover

Chometz products in the possession of a Jew during Passover are considered "chometz she-avar alav ha-Pesach" — prohibited products held during Passover. We are not permitted to derive any benefit from such products. At the conclusion of Passover, one should not use any Jewish baked products until we are certain that the products have been freshly baked.
