PRIME MINISTER YITZHAK RABIN'S MESSAGE TO WORLD JEWRY (Excerpts)

Between last Rosh Hashana and this, the universal Jewish family was rocked by the cruel war of Yom Kippur. Every Jew worthy of the name will surely be moved to pause on this Yom Kippur and remember what happened on that day of fasting and prayer a year ago when the nation of Israel, confronted by a terrible threat to its very life, rushed from its synagogues to meet the invading enemy. Let the "Yizkor" solemnly recall the awesome sacrifice of the sons of our people who with their bodies stemmed the onslaught, turned the tide of battle people who with their bodies stemmed the onslaught, turned the tide of battle and swept the enemy back. They were few against the many. They fought on behalf of the whole house of Israel and we are their legacy. For as we assemble now, each in his congregation, we testify afresh to our oneness as a great single congregation — the House of Israel — bound by the eternal ties of faith, heritage, history and common responsibility.

We shall win the peace providing we remain passionately loyal to our unique attachment. For this, ultimately, is our strength. It is a strength that has confounded every oppressor in every age.

Jews in the Soviet Union are demonstrating this truth day by day. They refuse to surrender their Jewish memory. Tens of thousands courageously demand their right to emigrate to the Jewish homeland . . . Israel, I know, speaks in the name of all Jews and in the name of decent people everywhere when it now decent people everywhere when it now reiterates afresh the appeal and the de-mand that the gates of Russia be opened to all Soviet Jews who wish to join their brethren in Israel, just as it calls upon Syria to let its remaining Jews go.
