Mr. Leisten is also Vice President of the Bethlehem Hebrew Congregation in New Hampshire.

LIPA AND NECHAMA SILBERSTEIN: Mr. Silberstein was a prominent manufacturer and businessman in Cracow before the war. Afterwards he lived in Paris for eleven years, where he was Gabbai of the Orthodox Congregation. Mrs. Silberstein likewise was born into a prominent family in Poland (Pinsk). She also experienced the war years in Europe and while living in Paris was president of Hadassah. In America they entered the real estate business. Mr. Silberstein is a Trustee of our Congregation and Mrs. Silberstein is a member of our Women's League.

DR. IRWIN SMIGEL: Husband of Lucille and father of Bellanca and Robert. Prominent dentist specializing in aesthetic dentistry; also lecturer and clinician teaching post-graduate dentistry. His father Dr. Sebastian Smigel was founder and first president of Congregation Bnai Israel Chaim on the West Side and his mother was a scion of the famed Soloveichik family. Dr. Smigel is a Trustee of our Synagogue.

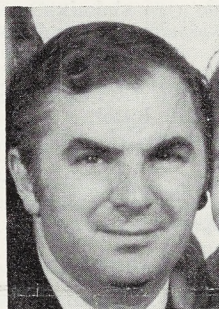

FIRST CHANUKAH CANDLE**SUNDAY NITE, DEC. 8**

Chanukah commemorates one of the major turning points in Jewish history. In the year 168 B.C.E., the Syrian Emperor Antiochus Epiphanus launched a campaign of religious persecution against the Jews. His soldiers desecrated the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. For three years Judah the Maccabee led a valiant army of loyal followers against the mighty Syrian legions. After routing the enemy hordes, they rededicated the Holy Temple and reestablished the traditional worship. This consecration was celebrated for eight days. To this day we kindle Chanukah lamps to celebrate not only the events of the hoary past but also as a symbol of the Almighty's mighty deeds throughout the ages.

The first candle is placed at the extreme right of the Menorah. Each night following, an additional candle is placed to the left of the previous one. However, the order of lighting the candles is from left to right — so that the added candle is kindled first.

On Friday (the candles should be large enough to last over an hour — Sabbath candles are recommended) we light the Chanukah candles *before* the Sabbath candles; on Saturday night the Chanukah candles are kindled at home *after* Havdalah is made.
