SHABBOS SHEKOLIM

Saturday, February 8th, marks the first of the Special Sabbaths preparatory to the Passover Festival. This day is known as Shabbos Shekolim and falls on Rosh Chodesh Adar or on the Sabbath preceding Rosh Chodesh.

In the days of the Temple in Jerusalem it was the custom to remind all of their obligation to give the half shekel on the first day of Adar. The special Torah reading, "Parshah," refers to the half shekel that every Israelite, twenty years of age or over, gave as his equal share toward the support of the Temple services (Exodus XXX:11-16).

Observations on Shabbos Shekolim

Commenting on the verse in Exodus XXVI:15, "And thou shalt make the boards for the Tabernacle of acacia-wood standing up," Rashi notes that the boards were to be standing vertically in the walls of the tabernacle and not lying horizontally.

Our sages in *Talmud Yoma 72a* discern added significance in the expression "standing up." They observe that should our people be about to lose hope, they can find encouragement and strength in the Biblical exhortation, "standing up" forever and ever.

The Biblical commentary *Torah Temimah* elaborates further that notwithstanding the Tabernacle structure was "hidden" with the building of the first Temple in Jerusalem, its significance and aspirations were never meant to be lost from our ken. Thus the Jews were to associate their remembrance of the Tabernacle with the "standing" boards denoting eternal spiritual dynamism. This insight relating to the structure of the Tabernacle is likewise the key to the appreciation of the public reading of *Parshas Shekolim* — even though we lack the Holy Temple and the applicable Shekolim. For as long as Jews in the course of their checkered history will not lose their faith in the ultimate restoration of the Holy Temple, every creative effort they make geared to its realization is in the spirit of the eternal "standing" walls. Thus through the merits of the offerings we make nowadays for the survival of Torah institutions, in the spirit of the Shekolim yore, may we be worthy to behold the restoration of the Holy Temple in Jerusalem when *Parshas Shekolim* and *Parshas Parah* will again be resumed in all their glory.

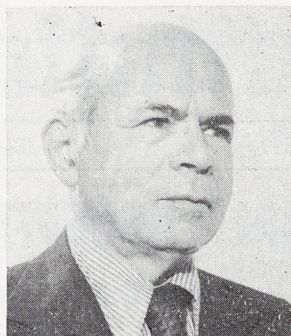

CHAMISHAH ASAR B'SHEVAT MONDAY, JANUARY 27

Chamishah Asar B'Shevat (the fifteenth day of the Hebrew month Shevat) is the Jewish "Arbor Day." In Temple times this day determined the dating of the produce relating to tithes. The Mishnah refers to this day as Rosh Hashanah L'Ilanos (New Year for Trees). It is also called Tu (the *teth* and *vav* Hebrew letters total fifteen) B'Shevat.

Chamishah Asar B'Shevat is observed by the eating of fruit products for which the Holy Land is noted, such as dates, figs, olives, pomegranates, grapes, almonds and carob ("bokser"). We partake of one of these fruits, which we have not as yet eaten during the year, for the purpose of making the blessing of "Shehechyanu." The Tachanun prayers are omitted thereon.
