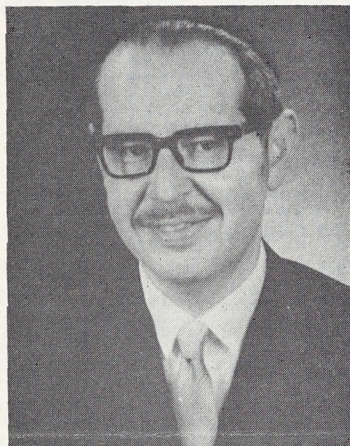

COLPA: Jews Fight for Rights

The following is an excerpt from an article that appeared in a recent issue of THE ADVOCATE, the student newspaper of Fordham University School of Law.

For years a minority group comprising no more than about 3% of the citizens of the United States has been in the forefront of nearly every fight for the down-trodden and/or minority blocs within this country — but its own. A rabbi marched arm in arm with Martin Luther King, Jr. in his most celebrated marches, representing the disproportionately high percentage of Jews among the whites in the NAACP and the civil rights movement in general. Samuel Gompers, a London-born Jew of Dutch origin, was a founder and the first president of the American Federation of Labor (AFL). A Jew named Hillquit led the Socialist party to record votes in New York City mayoralty elections over fifty years ago. In recent times, Bella Abzug, a former Hebrew School teacher in an Orthodox synagogue, has become virtually a symbol of women's lib. The anti-war and other anti-establishment student movements, most notably at Columbia, that galvanized the country were and remain inspired in large measure by Jewish students.

Name the cause, and you will undoubtedly have found Jews fighting the establishment to break old barriers. Incredibly, not until 1965 did a minority of a minority — a group of Orthodox Jews — band together to form an organization with a *raison d'être* of providing legal protection for those Jews that wished to assert their religiosity. That is, the right to practice their religion in addition to believing in it.

Mr. Dennis Rapps, Executive Director of this organization, the National Jewish Commission on Law and Public Affairs (COLPA), explained the need for and the uniqueness of his organization as follows: "The existing Jewish defense organizations that attempted to defend Jewish interests served a very useful purpose. They provided the service of helping Jews from overseas fight against discrimination because they were Jewish. But their focus was to see to it that Jews be considered the same as all others. They didn't focus on our DIFFERENCES based on religious practices or move in a concerted way to protect our special needs.

"Historically, discrimination," said Mr. Rapps, "was always a question of intent. You could do whatever you wanted as long as you did it to everybody equally. We of COLPA introduced the concept of impact into the field of religious discrimination. Perhaps our greatest achievement was the 1972 amendment to the Civil Rights Act of 1964 that we drafted to secure religious practice protection nationwide." By this landmark legislation, an employer must make "reasonable accommodation" to the religious needs of employees — and prospective employees — unless he can demonstrate that such accommodation would cause "undue hardship" to the conduct of his business.

"We don't like to go to court," asserts the incumbent president, attorney Sidney Kwestel. "Our goal is not to have to fight." Very often the problems can be resolved by a single quick phone call to the employer. At times the employer simply has to be informed as to his legal obligations and the complainant, in turn, must be apprised of his rights. "We generally try to convince the companies on an individual level but most of the cases we bring have industry-wide implications" explains Kwestel. "Actually," he continued, "it's not simply a self-serving accommodation—the state also has an interest in equal employment opportunity. We're also not asking for something for nothing. We expect our clients to cooperate fully with the employer in return. Time taken for religious observance must either be made up or an appropriate deduction from salary is made. It's also very interesting how companies often say 'We don't think we can do it,' yet once they find out that the law requires them to do it, they discover how easy it is, and that they can do it!"

COLPA has approximately 300 members — all volunteers — nationwide, 95% of whom are in the legal profession. (The other 5% are social scientists.) Of the 95% about 90% are lawyers; the rest, law students. About 600 people call COLPA's central office in New York annually, with potential cases.

Although Sabbath observance problems remain the major focus, other areas of concern to COLPA range from the right to wear beards on the job to problems that affect the mainstream of Orthodox Jewry, like aid to the secular programs offered in day schools which many Jews consider essential to their spiritual survival, immediate burial on legal holidays (traditional Judaism considers it a desecration of the honor of the dead to delay the burial even by a day) and the right to die free of fear of being chopped up by a doctor conducting an autopsy (traditional Judaism considers willful mutilation of a human body — dead or alive — to be a desecration).
