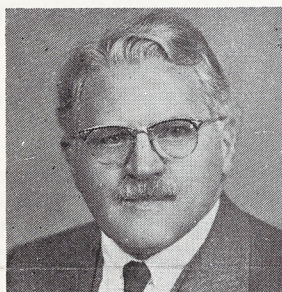

High Holy Days 5736

Rosh Hashanah Eve

As with every Festival, Kiddush is recited over the wine and Shehecheyanu is added. On the second night, a new fruit which has not yet been eaten in its season is placed on the table for the Shehecheyanu of the Kiddush which embraces also the fruit. It is customary to dip the Hamotzi in honey to denote a sweet year.

The Shofar

One of the awe inspiring portions of the New Year service is the sounding of the Shofar, the ram's horn calling to penitence. As the Shofar is not sounded on the Sabbath, it will be heard only on Sunday this year. Mr. Nash Aussenberg will again blow the shofar in the main Sanctuary and Mr. Shelly Schneider will again blow the shofar at our auxiliary services.

Tashlich

A moving and deeply symbolic ritual known as Tashlich takes place on Rosh Hashanah when we go to a body of water

and resolve to free ourselves of our sins, as we read in *Micah*, "And you shalt cast all your sins into the depths of the sea." When the first day is on Saturday, as this year, the ceremony is observed on Sunday.

Our Hebrew School pupils as well as all youngsters will assemble in front of the Synagogue at 6:00 o'clock, and will proceed together to Central Park for the observance of Tashlich. Delicious sweets will be distributed with the compliments of the House of Gross.

Shabbas Shuvah

The Sabbath following Rosh Hashanah is known as the Sabbath of Repentance because of the Haftarah chanted on this Sabbath from the Prophetic Book of Hosea which begin with the words, SHUVAH YISRAEL, "Return (or repent) O Israel to they G-d."

As is customary every year, Rabbi Reichel will deliver the Shabbas Shuvah Halachic Discourse after Minchah.

Erev Yom Kippur—Sun., Sept. 14

The Erev Yom Kippur Minchah service precedes the final meal of that day. The "Al

Chate" prayer of Yom Kippur is added to the Shmoneh Esray (see Yom Kippur machzor). Successive Minchah services on Erev Yom Kippur are conducted at our Synagogue from 2:00 to 3:00 P.M.

Reminder: Bring non-leather footwear for Yom Kippur beginning with Kol Nidrei.

Yom Kippur

The solemn Season of Repentance reaches its highest climax on Yom Kippur. On this day we must be sincere in our desire to repent and observe the Biblical command of depriving ourselves of food, drink, washing, and anointing of our bodies, wearing of leather shoes and other earthly pleasures.

Succos

On Friday eve, September 19, we usher in the Festival of Tabernacles. Following the solemn High Holidays, it is in contrast a time of thanksgiving and joy.

Breakfast in the Succah will be available following each of the weekday morning services.

The fifth day of Chol Hamoed is called Hoshana Rabbah. It is on this day that the decrees of Yom Kippur are sealed and the fate prescribed therein for each individual takes effect. Seven circuits are made this day with the "four species," while chanting the Hoshana prayers.

Esrogim and lulavim may be ordered from Rabbi Pekier.
