DANGERS OF THE EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT

The Equal Rights Amendment will be on the ballot in New York State this November. I feel that we, as intelligent voters, should give some thought to the tremendous drawbacks that this amendment has for women. At this time I think that we are being carried away with the tide of women's liberalism and propaganda. Personally, I have always felt that being a woman was a distinct advantage, especially in the United States, where men for the most part have protected and respected women.

Women have been the heart of the home and the home has been the heart of America. Most of the widespread contemporary ills—crime, drugs, and immorality—stem from the breakdown of family life. The family is the cornerstone of an ordered society. Through the Bible, Judaism contributed to the style of the basic social unit as it exists in Western civilization.

The Equal Rights Amendment could well be the turning point regarding our family way of life in America. As an American and as a Jew this worries me greatly.

The Equal Rights Amendment gives nothing to women that they don't already have under existing laws! The rights this proposed amendment purports to safeguard are already protected in the Fourteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, as well as the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Equal Pay Act of 1963, and the Health Manpower Training Act of 1971.

The Equal Rights Amendment will NOT give women "equal pay for equal work", better paying jobs, promotions, or better working conditions. The E.R.A. will add nothing whatsoever to the Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1972.

The Equal Rights Amendment TAKES AWAY: Protective labor laws; draft exemptions; protective rape and obscenity laws; and right of privacy laws. (Sources: Yale Law Journal, April 1971; Congressional Record, March 22, 1972.) How are these laws taken away? By making unconstitutional ANY law based on consideration of sex.

Regarding Draft Exemption: Although at present there is no draft, one does not know what the future portends. If the possibility of a draft again emerges in the U.S. it would then be "unpatriotic" to ask for Jewish girls' exemptions. "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure." A young mother was recently asked why she would prefer to have her sons drafted, than her daughters. She replied: "I do not think it is the obligation of young women. I would let my teenage sons go alone at night in the big city, but not my teenage daughters."

Regarding Right of Privacy: Senator Sam Ervin, who was regarded as the U.S. Senate's number one constitutional expert,

concluded that if the amendment passes, all laws which segregate the sexes in places such as private schools, prisons, dormitories, and rest-rooms will be stricken from the books. Furthermore, Ervin read into the Congressional Record that "Segregation by sex in hospitals would be outlawed." Considering the records of many hospitals to ignore patients' wishes on matters ranging from kosher food to circumcision, even if sexually segregated rooms would be requested, such requests would obviously not always be answered.

Although on the surface the proposed amendment appears harmless, it raises the potential for interpretation by the courts of a legislative mandate against aid, or G-d forbid, the very existence of yeshivos and recreational and social facilities of all types where the sexes will be separated. You may ask, "Who could ever oppose the existence of yeshivos as we know them today, in light of the first amendment's guarantee of freedom of religion?" The answer is that not merely atheists but some of the most established Jewish organizations have gone to court against principles like tax credits even for secular departments of yeshivos!

If a religious practice is judged to be against social policy, it can be banned or at least partially restricted in the U.S.A., First Amendment notwithstanding. This was the basis of a ruling by the IRS regarding tax exempt status, quoted in the New York Times May 23, 1975, when segregation along color lines was required by certain religious beliefs. If many E.R.A. people have their way, it is only logical that this could soon be extended to segregation on the basis of sex. You can see the problems this portends for authentic Judaism on the American scene. (See 80 Harvard Law Review 1381.)

Everyone should be aware of the profound dangers lurking in this seemingly innocent amendment. The Equal Rights Amendment is really a misnomer. It is an Equal Liabilities Amendment because all it would create for women is EQUAL LIABILITIES. The woman's problem in the U.S., legalistically, as already demonstrated, is gone. The existing laws simply have to be enforced. The problems facing the Jew, on the other hand, demand our eternal vigilance.
