THE SHEMA

The time for the morning recitation of the three *Shema* paragraphs commences with day-break and extends to the end of the first quarter of the day, which is calculated from sunrise to sunset.

As the day grows longer the time for the *Shema* readings becomes earlier — by June 7 the time will be about 9:00 A.M. As the days approach September, it may be recited one-half hour later.

Thus it is advisable to recite the *Shema* paragraphs at home before coming to services in order to assure the reading within the proper time. If delayed, the *Shema* and the blessings thereof should still be recited, up to one third of the day; thereafter the "Shema" should be read without the benedictions.

Tribute to a Spiritual Giant

RABBI DR. SAMUEL BELKIN OF YESHIVA UNIVERSITY

In Talmud Yevamos we are told that as soon as the teachings of the departed are repeated in this world, their lips move gently in the grave. In the spirit of this Talmudic dictum excerpts from Dr. Belkin's writings are being reprinted here:

It is frequently stated that Rabbinic Judaism did not develop a highly systematic theology, or a philosophy of theology. True, Judaism has fundamental doctrines concerning G-d, creation, revelation, prophecy, particular providence and many other basic creeds, but our Sages speculated little about metaphysical ideologies. They did, however, consecrate their intellectual abilities to the preservation, interpretation, and transmission of the Law. Some of our antagonists, particularly the antinomians, Jew and non-Jew alike, often charge us with espousing "legalism." In one respect, perhaps, our critics are right, for our main concern is with the meaning of the Divine Law and its relation to our actual living. I believe, however, that the following illustration will make clear the true essence of traditional Judaism.

Every structure which exists and which is safely inhabited by men, must have had an architect who first prepared the blue-prints for its construction. The greater and more permanent the structure, the more supreme must have been the designer, the architect. Once, however, man moves into the building, he no longer constantly checks and reviews the architectural design, in fact, the architectural design is usually placed in a vault.

The significance of the architectural design is never minimized, but it is hardly ever studied in detail. We live in our houses because of our faith that the architects who planned them drew up the proper blueprints and

that they are well-built. Man, however, must know the home in which he lives; how to use it so as not to abuse it; how to preserve it; for what purposes he may use his home; what things, if used in his home, would endanger his safety and disintegrate his dwelling. When a man begins to re-study carefully the architectural designs, it is indeed a sign that he finds his home uncomfortable or inadequate and wants either to demolish or alter it.

Dogma and theology are, in a sense, the architectural designs of all religions. In Judaism the dogma is the design and the Torah is the home in which a Jew lives, the structure which shelters him and offers him safety and spiritual security. Our Sages, therefore, in their profound wisdom, felt that their greatest responsibility was to preserve the home of Judaism, to transmit its essence — its composite of brick and mortar, to continue the metaphor. They felt in their duty to discover what it is that G-d demands of man, rather than to endlessly expound a particularized and detailed analysis of every line, every figure, in the architectural blueprint of Judaism. When dogma, speculative theology, and metaphysics reign supreme in Judaism, it is clear that our people have forsaken their home and are attempting to live only by studying the original architectural design while the structure itself is buried in a vault. When that is the case, it is inevitable that ultimately even the architectural blueprint itself will lose all meaning.
