FIRST SELICHOS SERVICE SATURDAY NIGHT, SEPT. 18

With Selichos, the penitential prayers which are to be recited Saturday night, September 18, at 10:30 o'clock, we begin to attune ourselves to the spiritual atmosphere of the High Holy Days.

Our congregants are urged to invite their neighbors and friends to join them for an evening of spiritual inspiration.

Rosh Hashanah Eve

Kiddush and Shehecheyanu are recited over the wine. After the Hamotzi and eating of the challah, we eat some apple dipped in honey which is preceded by the blessing over fruit and followed by: "May it be Thy will, G-d and G-d of our fathers, to grant us a happy and pleasant New Year."

On the second night, a fruit which we have not yet eaten in its season is placed on the table at the time of Kiddush. The Shehecheyanu applies also to this fruit. After the Hamotzi, and partaking of the challah, a prayer over the fruit precedes its eating.

The Shofar

The sounding of the Shofar, the ram's horn calling us to penitence, is one of the awe inspiring highlights of the New Year service. As the Shofar is not sounded on the Sabbath, it will be heard this year only on Sunday. Mr. Nash Aussenberg and Mrs. Shelley Schneider will again blow the Shofar in our main Sanctuary and auxiliary services respectively.

Tashlich

A moving and deeply symbolic ritual known as Tashlich takes place on Rosh Hashanah when we go to a body of water and resolve to free ourselves of our sins, as we read in Micah, "And you shalt cast all your sins into the depths of the sea." When the first day is on Saturday, as this year, the ceremony is observed on Sunday.

Our Hebrew School pupils as well as all youngsters will assemble in front of the Synagogue at 5:15 o'clock, and will proceed together to Central Park for the observance of Tashlich. Delicious sweets will be distributed with the compliments of the House of Gross.

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Shabbas Shuvah

The Sabbath following Rosh Hashanah is known as Shabbas Shuvah (Sabbath of Repentance) because of the Haftarah which begins with the words from Hosea "Shuvah Yisrael" — "Return (or repent) O Israel to thy G-d."

As is customary, Rabbi Reichel will deliver the Shabbas Shuvah Halachic discourse after Minchah.

Erev Yom Kippur—Sunday, Oct. 3

The Erev Yom Kippur Minchah service precedes the final meal of that day. The "Al Chate" prayer of Yom Kippur is added to the Shmoneh Essray (see Yom Kippur machzor). Successive Minchah services on Erev Yom Kippur are conducted at our Synagogue from 2:00 to 2:40 P.M.

Yom Kippur

The solemn Season of Repentance reaches its highest climax on Yom Kippur. On this day we must be sincere in our desire to repent and observe the Biblical command of depriving ourselves of food, drink, washing, and anointing of our bodies, wearing of leather shoes and other earthly pleasures.

Reminder: Wear non-leather footwear to the Yom Kippur services beginning with Kol Nidrei.

Succos

On Friday eve, October 9th, we usher in the Festival of Tabernacles. Following the solemn High Holidays, it is in contrast a time of thanksgiving and joy.

Breakfast in the Succah will be available following each of the weekday morning services.

Esrogim and lulavim may be ordered from Rabbi Pekier.

High Holy Days Seats

All of our readers can show their appreciation for our synagogue by reserving seats in our sanctuary and auditorium (both air-conditioned) for the coming Holy Days.

All seats in the main sanctuary are \$50; in the auditorium, \$25. Cantor Irving Silver will chant the Mussaf at the Auxiliary services.

Every worshipper receives a holiday prayerbook with an English translation. If unable to read Hebrew fluently, one may follow the services in English. Thus all can participate in the genuine, historical order of our hallowed prayers.
