PURIM NOTES

Parshas Zachor

The Purim theme starts on the Saturday before Purim when we read in an additional Scroll of the Torah, "Zachor—Remember what Amalek did to you" (Deut. XXV:17-19), the description of the cowardly attack of the Amalekites against the Israelites in the desert. According to tradition, Haman was a descendant of the Amalekites.

Fast of Esther, Thursday, March 3

The day before Purim is observed as a minor fast day in commemoration of the fasting of the Jews before their deliverance as well as the fast proclaimed by Queen Esther.

Reading of Megillah

Thursday Night, March 3 and
 Friday Morning, March 4

Purim celebrates the deliverance of the Jews of Persia from extermination by the plot of Haman, Prime Minister of King Ahasuerus of Persia, 2,333 years ago. He chose the 13th day of Adar by casting lots from which the name Purim is derived. By the vigilance of Mordecai, who exposed a conspiracy against the king's life, and the intervention of his cousin, Esther the Queen, the Jews were saved. The crafty Haman was hanged on his own gallows which he had prepared for Mordecai and the King appointed Mordecai Prime Minister in his place.

Children Welcome

It is obligatory upon men, women and children to listen to the reading of the entire Megillah at night and day because all were included in this evil decree of Haman.

Our parents and grandparents are urged to come with their children to the Purim services on Thursday night at 6:10 and on Friday morning. The children will receive the traditional greggers and hamantashen with the compliments of our Women's League.

Purim Mitzvas

The Book of Esther also enjoins us to make Purim a special occasion for giving gifts, known

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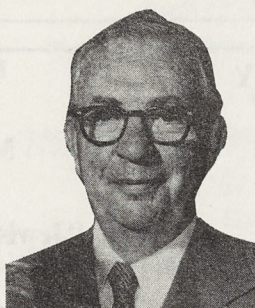

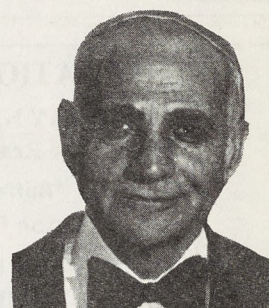

as "Mishloach Manos", consisting of at least two portions of prepared food. We are also to give charity that day to the poor.

On Purim day we are obliged to partake of a festive meal, usually before sundown. Because Purim day falls on Friday this year, and preparations for the Sabbath should not be interrupted, the "Seudah" should be advanced to the morning meal.

The day after Purim is called Shushan Purim in commemoration of the Jews of Shushan who defended themselves for two days.

Parshas Shekolim

Saturday, February 19th marks the first of the Special Sabbaths preparatory to the Passover festival. This day is known as Shabbos Shekolim and falls on the Sabbath Rosh Chodesh Adar as this year or on the Sabbath preceding it.

In the days of the Temple in Jerusalem it was the custom to remind all of their obligation to give the half shekel on the first day of Adar. The special Torah reading, *Parshah*, refers to the half shekel that every Israelite, twenty years of age or over, gave as his equal share toward the support of the Temple services (Exodus XXX:11-16).

CHAMISHAH ASAR B'SHEVAT
THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 3

Chamishah Asar B'Shevat (the fifteenth day of the Hebrew month Shevat) is the Jewish "Arbor Day." In Temple times this day determined the dating of the produce relating to tithes. The Mishnah refers to this day as Rosh Hashanah L'Ilanos (New Year for Trees). It is also called Tu (the *teth* and *vav* Hebrew letters total fifteen) B'Shevat.

Chamishah Asar B'Shevat is observed by the eating of fruits for which the Holy Land is noted, such as dates, figs, olives, pomegranates, grapes, almonds and carob ("bokser"). We partake of one of these fruits, which we have not as yet eaten during the year, for the purpose of making the blessing of "Shehechiyanu." The Tachanun prayers are omitted that day.
