First Selichos Sept. 3

With Selichos, the penitential prayers which are to be recited Saturday night, September 3rd at 10:30 o'clock, we begin to attune ourselves to the spiritual atmosphere of the High Holy Days.

Our congregants are urged to invite their neighbors and friends to join them for an evening of spiritual inspiration.

Rosh Hashanah Eve

Kiddush and Shehechyanu are recited over the wine. After the Hamotzi and eating of the challah, some apple dipped in honey is preceded by the blessing over fruit and followed by: "May it be Thy will, G-d and G-d of our fathers, to grant us a happy and pleasant New Year."

On the second night, a fruit which we have not yet eaten in its season is placed on the table at the time of Kiddush. The Shehechyanu applies also to this fruit. After the Hamotzi, and partaking of the challah, a prayer over the fruit is recited.

The Shofar

The sounding of the Shofar, the ram's horn calls to penitence. Nash Aussenberg and Shelly Schneider will again blow the Shofar in our main sanctuary and auxiliary services respectively.

Tashlich

A moving and deeply symbolic ritual known as Tashlich takes place on Rosh Hashanah when we go to a body of water and resolve to free ourselves of our sins, as we read in **Micah**, "And you shall cast all your sins into the depths of the sea."

Our Hebrew School pupils as well as all youngsters will assemble in front of the Synagogue at 5:45 o'clock, and will proceed together to Central Park for the observance of Tashlich. Delicious sweets will be distributed with the compliments of the House of Gross.

Shabbas Shuvah

The Sabbath following Rosh Hashanah is known as Shabbas Shuvah (Sabbath of Repentance) because of the Haftarah which begins with the words from Hosea "Shuvah Yisrael" — "Return (or repent) O Israel to thy G-d."

As is customary, Rabbi Reichel will deliver the Shabbas Shuvah Halachic discourse after Minchah.

RESERVE SUNDAY, DECEMBER 10 // for our ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL GALA DINNER

Erev Yom Kippur — Wed., Sept. 21

The Erev Yom Kippur Minchah service precedes the final meal of that day. The "Al Chate" prayer of Yom Kippur is added to the Shmoneh Esray (see Yom Kippur machzor). Successive Minchah services on Erev Yom Kippur are conducted at our Synagogue from 2:00 to 2:45.

The solemn Season of Repentance reaches its highest climax on Yom Kippur. On this day we must be sincere in our desire to repent and observe the Biblical command of depriving ourselves of food, drink, washing, and anointing of our bodies, wearing of leather shoes and other earthly pleasures.

Reminder: Wear non-leather footwear to the Yom Kippur services beginning with Kol Nidrei.

Succos

On Monday eve, September 26th, we usher in the Festival of Tabernacles. Following the solemn High Holidays, it is in contrast a time of thanksgiving and joy.

Breakfast in the Succah will be available following each of the weekday morning services.

Esrogim and lulavim may be ordered from Rabbi Pekier.

From a recent Jewish Telegraphic Agency national press release:

Resolutions backing the Equal Rights Amendment and liberalized abortion adopted by the New York State Women's Meeting which took place July 8-10 in Albany, were criticized by Mrs. Josephine Reichel, national co-chairman of Agudah Women of America. The Agudah Women leader also charged that Orthodox women were purposely excluded because of their firm position on these key issues affecting women. She pointed to the meeting's holding its main sessions on Saturday, the Jewish Sabbath, as the best example of the attempts of the conference to exclude women with different ideas. Without the participation of Orthodox Jewish women, the conference automatically spoke without the collective voice of thousands of women in New York State.

The Albany conference is a prelude to the National Women's Conference which will take place in November.
