#### ASARAH BETEVES FAST TUESDAY, DECEMBER 20

This fast commemorates the beginning of the fatal siege of Jerusalem by the armies of Nebuchadnezer, King of Babylon, which culminated in the destruction of the first Temple in 586 B.C.E. Selichos prayers are said in the morning and a penitential portion of the Torah is read both at the Shacharis and at the Minchah services.

#### CHAMISHAH ASAR B'SHEVAT MONDAY, JANUARY 23

Chamishah Asar B'Shevat (the fifteenth day of the Hebrew month Shevat) is the Jewish "Arbor Day." In Temple times this day determined the dating of the produce relating to tithes. The Mishnah refers to this day as Rosh Hashanah L'Ilanos (New Year for Trees). It is also called Tu (the teth and vav Hebrew letters total fifteen) R'Shevat

Chamishah Asar B'Shevat is observed by the eating of fruit products for which the Holy Land is noted, such as dates, figs, olives, pomegranates, grapes, almonds and carob ("bokser"). We partake of one of these fruits, which we have not as yet eaten during the year, for the purpose of making the blessing of "Shehechiyanu." The Tachanun prayers are omitted thereon.

#### THE MONTH OF SHEVAT

Shevat is always a full month of thirty days, with its thirtieth day counting simultaneously as the first of two days of Rosh Chodesh Adar. However Rosh Chodesh Shevat is always one day.

On the first of this month Moses delivered his farewell to the Jews, which was recorded in the Book of Deuteronomy beginning with Chapter I. The Sages have observed that the first of Shevat is comparable to the day of the giving of the Torah. Just as the sixth of Sivan (Shavuos) remains forever especially suitable for the renewed acceptance of the Torah, similarly is the heart of the Jew receptive to the influence of Torah on the first of Shevat since Deuteronomy, known as Mishnah Torah ("repetition of the Torah"), was given to the Israelites on that day.
