PURIM NOTES

The Purim theme starts on the Saturday before Purim when we read in an additional Scroll of the Torah, "Zachor—Remember what Amalek did to you" (Deut. XXV:17-19), describing the cowardly attack of the Amalekites against the Israelites in the desert. Haman was a descendant of the Amalekites.

Fast of Esther, Wednesday, March 22

The day before Purim is observed as a minor fast day in commemoration of the fasting of the Jews before their deliverance as well as the fast proclaimed by Queen Esther.

Reading of Megillah, Wednesday Night, March 22, and Thursday Morning

Purim celebrates the deliverance of the Jews of Persia from extermination by the plot of Haman, Prime Minister of King Ahasuerus of Persia, 2,334 years ago. He chose the 13th day of Adar by casting lots from which the name Purim is derived. By the vigilance of Mordecai, who exposed a conspiracy against the king's life, and the intervention of his cousin, Esther the Queen, the Jews were saved. The crafty Haman was hanged on his own gallows which he had prepared for Mordecai and the King appointed Mordecai Prime Minister in his place.

The WSIS Men's Club proudly announces that Anita Aronoff, Soprano, and Dmitry Sitkovetsky, violinist, will be the recipients of the 1978 Annual Youth Concert Awards to be presented at the concert on Sunday afternoon, April 9th, at 3:00 P.M.

While still a student at the High School of Music and Art, Miss Anita Aronoff sang the solo part with the All-City Chorus at Carnegie Hall. She continued her education at Boston University. Her first singing teacher was her father who under the name of Silvio Ricci had a long operatic career in Europe and at the Metropolitan Opera and later became a Cantor (Solomon Reese) at a Brooklyn Synagogue.

Miss Aronoff has to her credit her own Radio Program on WNYC, "Let's All Sing Together," and a CBS Children's Program, "Just Around the Corner."

In recent years Miss Aronoff has directed her efforts to the operatic field. She has sung major roles with the New York Grand Opera and the Opera Company of Nassau. For her performance in Turandot, Miss Aronoff was acclaimed by music critic Peter Davis of the N.Y. Times as a "Promising Spinto Soprano."

Mr. Dmitry Sitkovetsky, violinist, is a 24-year-old Russian refugee who arrived in the United States only last September. At the age of 12 he won the first prize at the Prague competition for young musicians and recently was a Laureate Winner at the Montreal International Violin Competition. At an all-Bach Concert Mr. Sitkovetsky created a "sensation" as reported by the Berliner Morganpost which stated, "It looks like he will become a worthy successor of David Oistrach."

Mr. Sitkovetsky has performed as soloist with orchestras in Moscow and Leningrad. He is at present continuing his studies with Ivan Galamian at Juilliard School and has recently been appointed Concert Master of the National Orchestra of New York.

Piano accompanist for Anita Aronoff will be Ruth Bierhoff. Piano accompanist for Dmitry Sitkovetsky will be Julie Lustman.

The Artist Selection Committee, Herman H. Cohen and Alexander Rauchman, believe that the April 9th Concert will equal the high level of artistry of previous concerts. Among the former Concert Award recipients were Neil Shicoff, now a leading tenor of the Metropolitan Opera; Sigmund Cowan, who made his debut at the New York City Opera; Robert Belasco, who will sing the leading tenor role in Janacek's Opera Jenufa with the American Opera Theatre at Lincoln Center this Spring; Stephen Texon with the New Jersey State Opera and Cantor in New City; Morris Wolk, Cantor in Plainview; Cheryl Markham of the N.J. Opera; and Itzhak Perlman, world-famous violinist.

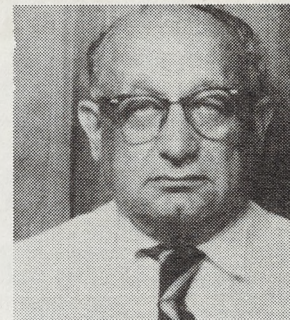
MEN'S CLUB NOTES

Parshas Shekalim

Saturday, March 4th, marks the first of the Special Sabbaths preparatory to the Passover festival. This day falls on the Sabbath preceding Rosh Chodesh Adar II.

The special Torah reading, *Parshah*, refers to the half shekel that every Israelite, twenty years of age or over, gave as his equal share toward the support of the Temple services in Jerusalem beginning with Adar.

PURIM NOTES (Continued)

It is obligatory upon men, women and children to listen to the reading of the entire Megillah at night and day because all were included in this evil decree.

Children Welcome

Our parents and grandparents are urged to come with their children to the Purim services on Wednesday evening at 5:45 (Minchah) and on Thursday morning. The children will receive greggers and hamantashan with the compliments of our Women's League.

Purim Mitzvas

The Book of Esther also enjoins us to make Purim a special occasion for giving gifts, known as "Mishloach Manos", consisting of at least two portions of prepared food. We are also to give charity that day to the poor.

On Purim day we are obliged to partake in a festive meal, usually before sundown.

The day after Purim is called Shushan Purim in commemoration of the Jews of Shushan who defended themselves for two days.
