Shabbos Hagadol

The Saturday before Passover is called "Shabbos Hagadol" or the Great Sabbath. At the Minchah service we read a part of the Passover Hagadah. Rabbi Reichel will deliver a discourse on laws relating to the Festival at the morning service.

What is Chometz?

Wheat, rye, barley, spelt and oats in contact with water become *chometz* unless prepared according to Jewish law. All vegetables and fruits may be used except rice, millet, peas and beans. If in doubt ask the Rabbi.

A guide to Passover foods published by the O-U is available free of charge in our Synagogue office.

Kashering

Metal pots and pans can be *kashered* by first thoroughly cleaning them at least a day before purging them in a vessel of boiling water. Utensils used directly over the fire may be *kashered* directly over the fire, allowing them to get red hot. Earthenware cannot be *kashered*. The Synagogue facilities for *kashering* will be available on Thursday, April 20th, from 9:30 to 10:30 A.M.

Every part of the stove must be cleaned and heated to a glow. Special tin sheets are placed over the top of the range.

Search for Leaven

The ritual searching for chometz (*Bedi-kas Chometz*) with the aid of a candle light, is to be conducted with the entire household on Thursday, April 20th after sunset. All leaven which we did not find during the search is then annulled by the recitation of "Kol Chamira" (the text is found in the introduction of many Hagadas). The crumbs which were collected at night should be burned by 10:45 on the

morrow when the second "Kol Chamira" should be recited.

No matzah may be eaten on Erev Pessach because we should eat matzah at the Seder with appetite.

Fast of the First-Born

Every first born should fast on Erev Pessach, in thankfulness to G-d for having spared the first born of the Israelites when He smote those of the Egyptians. One may forego the fast if he participates in the "Siyum Bechorim" which takes place after each of our morning services on Friday.

The Seder Plate

The roast shankbone and egg symbolize the Paschal lamb and festive offering in Temple times. The parsley (*karpas*) dipped in salt water, the bitter herbs (*maror*), and mixture of apples, nuts and wine (*charoses*), recall the servitude and toil of our ancestors in Egypt. Please note that romaine lettuce may be used for *maror*.

Counting of the Omer

The Counting of the Omer begins on the second night of Passover, and continues each evening until Shavuos. The Omer was a measure of barley which was offered on the second day of Passover at the Temple after which the Jews were permitted to eat the new harvest.

During the period of counting the Omer many tragedies occurred. Thus weddings

MATZOH OF OPPRESSION

It is appropriate that at the Seder we take to heart the plight of our brethren behind the Iron Curtain. Thus after partaking of the matzoh, we are to set aside another matzoh and recite the following:

We set aside this Lechem Oni, matzoh of oppression, to remember our three million brethren in the Soviet Union, most of whom cannot observe the mitzvah of matzoh tonight. Nor can they freely teach their children the heritage of their fathers.

Our voices shall be joined by men of conscience aroused by the injustice imposed on Soviet Jews. Then shall they know they have not been forgotten, and they that sit in darkness shall yet see a great light.

and other celebrations are avoided. Certain days are exempt from the prohibition.

Eruv Tavshilin Thursday April 27

It is not permissible to cook, bake or prepare food on one day of Yom Tov for the next day or for the Sabbath. The "Eruv Tavshilin" set aside prior to the Festival, enables us to cook on Friday Yom Tov for the Sabbath. Thus, the ceremony of Eruv Tavshilin should be performed on Chol Hamoed Thursday.

A matzah and some cooked food such as an egg are placed on a plate. The head of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ataw a-do----elo-kenu me-lech ha-olam asher kid'sha-nu bemitzvo-sav vetzi-vanu al mitzvas e-ruv ... By virtue of this eruv be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath." On Saturday afternoon this food is eaten.

Shir HaShirim

On Saturday morning, the last day of Passover, the Biblical book "Song of Songs" is chanted preceding the reading of the Torah. This series of songs by King Solomon is a poetic illustration of the love of G-d for His people, Israel.
