Though it is in the "Sefirah" period, weddings and haircuts are permitted on Lag B'Omer.

- 1886 Yeshiva Eitz Chaim established at 44 East Broadway.
- 1897 Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Spektor, Rabbi of Kovno, Lithuania, died in 1896. To perpetuate the memory of this eminent spiritual leader, a Yeshiva bearing his name was established as the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary (RIETS), at 47 East Broadway.
- 1904 RIETS acquired its own building at 156 Henry Street.
- 1915 Dr. Bernard Revel (born 1885) inaugurated as president.
 RIETS and Yeshiva Eitz Chaim merge and move to new quarters at 9-11 Montgomery Street.
- 1916 Talmudical Academy, the first Jewish academic high school in the United States, opened.
- 1921 Absorbed Teachers Institute founded by Mizrachi in 1917.
 Moved to 301 East Broadway.
- 1928 Yeshiva College established the first college of liberal arts and sciences under Jewish auspices.
- 1929 Moved to Washington Heights quarters constructed at a cost of \$2,500,000.
- 1941 Graduate School renamed Bernard Revel Graduate School.
- 1943 Dr. Samuel Belkin elected president.
- 1945 Harry Fischel School for Higher Jewish Studies established.
 High School for Boys-Brooklyn established.
 Charter amended to elevate institution to university the first in
- America under Jewish auspices.

 1948 School of Education added.

 Central Yeshiva High School for Girls in Brooklyn established.
- 1954 Stern College for Women opened at 253 Lexington Avenue (35th St.).
 Cantorial Training Institute established.
- 1955 Albert Einstein College of Medicine opened in the Bronx America's
