BARITONE ANDREWS AND VIOLINIST LUWISH AT WSIS CONCERT HALL SUNDAY APRIL 22, 3 P.M.

Tickets are still available for the Annual Youth Concert on Sunday, April 22nd, at 3 P.M. Baritone Roger Andrews will sing operatic arias and a group of Italian art songs. He will also sing a favorite of the Jewish singer, Leo Schmidt, whose career was halted by Hitler.

Violinist Shlomo Luwish will play selections from Beethoven, Ernest Bloch, Saint-Saens and Kreisler. A special feature of the program will be the world premiere of two selections composed by Prof. Joel Mendelbaum of Queens College. PASSOVER 5739

Shabbos Hagadol

The Saturday before Passover is called "Shabbos Hagadol" or the Great Sabbath. At the Minchah service we read a part of the Passover Haggadah. Rabbi Reichel will deliver a discourse on laws relating to the Festival at the morning service.

What is Chometz?

Wheat, rye, barley, spelt and oats in contact with water become *chometz* unless prepared according to Jewish law. All vegetables and fruits may be used except rice, millet, peas and beans. If in doubt ask the Rabbi.

A guide to Passover foods published by the O-U is available free of charge in our Synagogue office.

Kashering

Metal pots and pans can be *kashered* by first thoroughly cleaning them at least a day before purging them in a vessel of boiling water. Utensils used directly over the fire may be *kashered* directly over the fire, allowing them to get red hot. Earthenware cannot be *kashered*. The Syna-

gogue facilities for *kashering* will be available on Sunday, April 8th, from 10:30 to 11:30 A.M.

Every part of the stove must be cleaned and heated to a glow. Special tin sheets are placed over the top of the range.

Search for Leaven

The ritual searching for chometz (*Bedikas Chometz*) with the aid of a candle light is to be conducted with the entire household on Tuesday, April 10th, after sunset. All leaven which we did not find during the search is then annulled by the recitation of "Kol Chamira" (the text is found in the introduction of many Haggadas). The crumbs which were collected at night should be burned by 10:40 on the morrow when the second "Kol Chamira" should be recited.

No matzah may be eaten on Erev Pessach because we should eat matzah at the Seder with appetite.

Fast of the First-Born

Every first born should fast on Erev Pessach, in thankfulness to G-d for having spared the first born of the Israelites when He smote those of the Egyptians. One may forego the fast if he partici-

SALE OF CHOMETZ

Since we may not possess *chometz* on Passover it is necessary to transfer ownership of *chometz* before Passover out of our bounds. Rabbi Pekier will be available for the sale of *chometz* during the hours of daily services and Erev Pessach morning up to 9:00 o'clock. For those who cannot come to the Synagogue the coupon may be used.

pates in the "Siyum Bechorim" which takes place after each of our morning services on that day.

Eruv Tavshilin Erev Yom Tov

It is not permissible to cook or prepare food on one day of Yom Tov for the next or for the Sabbath. The "Eruv Tavshilin" set aside prior to the Festival enables us to cook on Friday Yom Tov for the Sabbath. Inasmuch as this year the first days of Passover will be on Thursday and Friday, the ceremony of "Eruv Tavshilin" should be performed on Wednesday.

A matzah and some cooked food such as an egg are placed on a plate. The head of the house lifts the plate and recites the following: "Boruch ata a-do---elo-kenu melech ha-olam asher kid-sha-nu bemitzvosav vetzivanu al mitzvas eruv... By virtue of this eruv be it permitted to us to bake, cook, keep food warm, light the candles, and do all that is necessary on the Festival for the Sabbath." On Saturday afternoon this food is eaten.

The Seder Plate

The roast shankbone and egg symbolize the Paschal lamb and festive offering in Temple times. The parsley (*karpas*) dipped in salt water, the bitter herbs (*maror*), and mixture of apples, nuts and wine (*charoses*), recall the servitude and toil of our ancestors in Egypt. Please note that romaine lettuce may be used for *maror*.

Counting of the Omer

The Counting of the *Omer* begins on the second night of Passover, and continues each evening until Shavuot. The *Omer* was a measure of barley which was offered on the second day of Passover on the Temple mount after which the new harvest was permitted to be eaten.

During the period of counting the *Omer* many tragedies occurred. Thus weddings and other celebrations are avoided. Certain days are exempt from the prohibition.

Chometz After Passover

Chometz products in the possession of a Jew during Passover are considered "chometz she'aver alav ha-Pesach" — prohibited products held during Passover. We are not permitted to derive any benefit from them. At the conclusion of Passover, one should not use any Jewish baked products until we are certain that the products have been freshly baked.
