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JEWISH PEOPLEHOOD WEEK JUNE 8-13 ON WEST SIDE Features WSIS Exhibit and Lecture by Rabbi Aaron Reichel on Monday 8 P.M. in Our Building

Our own West Side community is to be the host of an unprecedented event, JEWISH PEOPLEHOOD WEEK, from Sunday, June 8th to June 13th. This gala event is sponsored by the West Side Jewish Community Council composed of 56 institutions and agencies. It will demonstrate how West Side Jewish organizations play a vibrant role in New York Jewry.

On Sunday all along West End Avenue between 72nd and 93rd Streets, the public will be treated to exhibits, a Jewish food fair and concessions galore. During the week, individual constituents of the W.S.J.C.C. will sponsor lectures, films and other special events.

Our synagogue will host an exhibit in the synagogue building on "The West Side Institutional Synagogue—Its Roots as a Prototype Community Center." The exhibit will be on display during the same hours our office is open—Monday to Thursday 9 to 5, and Friday 9 to 1.

On Monday night, June 9th at 8:00, Rabbi Aaron I. Reichel, son of our Rabbi, will give a public lecture at our building in connection with our exhibit. He is currently completing a book on this subject. Refreshments will follow. There will be no charge.

SHAVUOS NOTES

On Tuesday evening, May 20th, the fiftieth day following the second day of Passover, we usher in the Festival of Shavuos, the Feast of Weeks. This holiday is of great significance in the Jewish calendar, for on this day we received the Torah on Mount Sinai. It is therefore known as "Zman Matan Toraseinu," the season of the giving of the Torah.

To commemorate this divine event we decorate our Synagogue with leaves and flowers reminiscent of the greenery atop Mt. Sinai. Our Women's League will again provide the floral decorations.

The Torah calls this day also *Chag Ha'asif* (Festival of Harvesting) — Exodus XXIII; and *Yom Habikurim* (Day of the First Fruit) — Numbers XXVIII.

Another hallowed tradition is the *Mishmar*, the all-night vigil and reciting *Tikun Shavuos*, selections from the Bible and Mishnah and other sacred writings.

It is a custom to eat dairy foods on this festival. One reason given is that the Torah has been likened to "milk and honey."

During the morning services of the first day we read from the Torah the Ten Commandments and chant the *Akdamos*, a beautiful poem in Aramaic, in adoration of the Almighty and the Torah. On the second day, the idyllic story of Ruth is read. This is to commemorate the *Yahrzeit* of King David who was descended from Ruth.
